11	§ 2710. Ethnic intimidation.
12	(a) Offense definedA person commits the offense of ethnic
13	intimidation if, with malicious intention toward the actual or
14	perceived race, color, religion [or], national origin, ancestry,
15	mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender or
16	gender identity of another individual or group of individuals,
17	he commits an offense under any other provision of this article
18	or under Chapter 33 (relating to arson, criminal mischief and

other property destruction) exclusive of section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism) or under section 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) with respect to such individual or his or her property or with respect to one or more members of such group or to their property.

7 (c) Definition.--As used in this section "malicious 8 intention" means the intention to commit any act, the commission of which is a necessary element of any offense referred to in 9 10 subsection (a) motivated by hatred toward the actual or perceived race, color, religion [or], national origin, ancestry, 11 12 mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, gender or 13 gender identity of another individual or group of individuals. Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 14
