AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 22, 2000 (P.L.394, No.54), entitled "An act requiring certain tobacco product manufacturers to place
- 3 certain moneys into an escrow fund; conferring powers and
- 4 duties upon the Attorney General and the Department of
- 5 Revenue; and imposing penalties, "further providing for
- 6 definitions.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The definition of "units sold" in section 3 of
- 10 the act of June 22, 2000 (P.L.394, No.54), known as the Tobacco
- 11 Settlement Agreement Act, is amended to read:
- 12 Section 3. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 14 have the meanings given to them in this section:
- 15 * * *
- 16 "Units sold." The number of individual cigarettes sold in
- 17 this Commonwealth by the applicable tobacco product manufacturer
- 18 during the year in question, as measured by taxes collected by
- 19 the Commonwealth on packs[, or "roll-your-own" tobacco

- 1 containers,] bearing the tax stamp of the Commonwealth required
- 2 under section 1215 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2),
- 3 known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, and by the number of
- 4 <u>ounces of "roll-your-own" tobacco sold by the applicable tobacco</u>
- 5 product manufacturer in this Commonwealth. The Department of
- 6 Revenue shall promulgate such regulations as are necessary to
- 7 ascertain the amount of State tax paid on the cigarettes of
- 8 [such] <u>a</u> tobacco product manufacturer for each year. <u>The</u>
- 9 Attorney General shall promulgate such regulations as are
- 10 necessary to ascertain the number of ounces of "roll-your-own"
- 11 tobacco sold by a tobacco product manufacturer for each year.
- 12 For purposes of this definition, 0.09 ounces of "roll-your-own"
- 13 tobacco is equivalent to one individual cigarette.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
