A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the month of October 2007 as "Agent Orange
- 2 Recognition Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, During the Vietnam War the Federal Government used
- 4 more than 10.6 million gallons of the herbicide and defoliant
- 5 2,4-D and 2,4,5-T, known as "Agent Orange"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Thousands of Vietnam War veterans have died due to
- 7 the use of Agent Orange, and thousands more still suffer with
- 8 the cancer and other health disorders caused by their exposure
- 9 to Agent Orange; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Veterans living with health problems caused by Agent
- 11 Orange must also live with the fact that genetic damage caused
- 12 by their exposure to Agent Orange may be handed down through
- 13 generations; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of October 2007
- 15 as "Agent Orange Recognition Month" in Pennsylvania in an effort
- 16 to bring attention to this issue so that it may continue to be
