A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating May 1, 2008, as "Loyalty Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 2 WHEREAS, The Department of Pennsylvania, Veterans of Foreign
- 3 Wars of the United States, is conducting its annual Loyalty Day"
- 4 program on the grounds of the State Capitol on May 1, 2008; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 1958 President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed into
- 6 law Public Law 85-529, which designates May 1 of each year as
- 7 "Loyalty Day"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, "Loyalty Day" is set aside as a special day for
- 9 reaffirming loyalty to the United States and recognizing
- 10 American freedom; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The President of the United States annually issues a
- 12 proclamation calling on officials to proudly display the flag of
- 13 the United States on all Government buildings on this special
- 14 day; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Citizens and elected officials are encouraged to
- 16 observe "Loyalty Day" in schools and other appropriate places;

- WHEREAS, In the post-9/11 world, it is fitting that the
- 3 citizens of this Commonwealth pause on "Loyalty Day" to reflect
- 4 on the privileges of freedom, democracy and unmatched
- 5 opportunity we enjoy in the United States; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate May 1, 2008, as "Loyalty
- 7 Day" in Pennsylvania, proudly joining the Department of
- 8 Pennsylvania, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, in
- 9 its observance and commending the department for its continued
- 10 service to our nation and this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 12 the VFW State Commander on May 1, 2008, at the "Loyalty Day"
- 13 program conducted by the Department of Pennsylvania, Veterans of
- 14 Foreign Wars of the United States, on the grounds of the State
- 15 Capitol.
