AN ACT

1 Amending the act of December 3, 1959 (P.L.1688, No.621),
2 entitled, as amended, "An act to promote the health, safety
3 and welfare of the people of the Commonwealth by broadening
4 the market for housing for persons and families of low and
5 moderate income and alleviating shortages thereof, and by
6 assisting in the provision of housing for elderly persons
7 through the creation of the Pennsylvania Housing Finance
8 Agency as a public corporation and government
9 instrumentality; providing for the organization, membership
10 and administration of the agency, prescribing its general
11 powers and duties and the manner in which its funds are kept
12 and audited, empowering the agency to make housing loans to
13 qualified mortgagors upon the security of insured and
14 uninsured mortgages, defining qualified mortgagors and
15 providing for priorities among tenants in certain instances,
16 prescribing interest rates and other terms of housing loans,
17 permitting the agency to acquire real or personal property,
18 permitting the agency to make agreements with financial
19 institutions and Federal agencies, providing for the purchase

1 by persons of low and moderate income of housing units, and
2 approving the sale of housing units, permitting the agency to
3 sell housing loans, providing for the promulgation of
4 regulations and forms by the agency, prescribing penalties
5 for furnishing false information, empowering the agency to
6 borrow money upon its own credit by the issuance and sale of
7 bonds and notes and by giving security therefor, permitting
8 the refunding, redemption and purchase of such obligations by
9 the agency, prescribing remedies of holders of such bonds and
10 notes, exempting bonds and notes of the agency, the income
11 therefrom, and the income and revenues of the agency from
12 taxation, except transfer, death and gift taxes; making such
13 bonds and notes legal investments for certain purposes; and
14 indicating how the act shall become effective," providing for
15 the Pennsylvania Housing Affordability and Rehabilitation
16 Enhancement Program; and establishing the Housing
17 Affordability and Rehabilitation Enhancement Fund.

18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
19 hereby enacts as follows:

20 Section 1. The act of December 3, 1959 (P.L.1688, No.621),
21 known as the Housing Finance Agency Law, is amended by adding an
22 article to read:

23 ARTICLE IV-D

24 PENNSYLVANIA HOUSING AFFORDABILITY AND REHABILITATION

25 ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM

26 Section 401-D. Definitions.

27 The following words and phrases when used in this article
28 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
29 context clearly indicates otherwise:

30 "Fund." The Housing Affordability and Rehabilitation
31 Enhancement Fund established in section 406-D.

32 "Persons with disabilities." Individuals with physical,
33 sensory or mental impairment that substantially limits one or
34 more major life activities.

35 "Program." The Pennsylvania Housing Affordability and
36 Rehabilitation Enhancement Program established in section 402-D.

37 "PROGRAM FUNDS." THE TERM SHALL INCLUDE ALL ALLOCATIONS
38 DISTRIBUTED TO AND GRANTS RECEIVED BY THE COMMONWEALTH FROM THE



1 UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT
2 PURSUANT TO THE HOUSING TRUST FUND, ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 1338
3 OF THE HOUSING AND ECONOMIC RECOVERY ACT OF 2008 (PUBLIC LAW
4 110-289, 122 STAT. 2654), AND FUNDS FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN THE
5 COMMONWEALTH THAT ARE PROVIDED FOR THE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER
6 THIS ARTICLE. THE TERM MAY ALSO INCLUDE FUNDS SPECIFICALLY
7 APPROPRIATED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR THE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED
8 UNDER THIS ARTICLE.

9 Section 402-D. Establishment.

10 There is established the Pennsylvania Housing Affordability
11 and Rehabilitation Enhancement Program to be administered by the
12 agency. The program is dependent upon funds available in the
13 fund SHALL BE DEPENDENT ON THE AVAILABILITY OF PROGRAM FUNDS.

14 Section 403-D. Program.

15 (a) Project types.--The program may provide funding for the
16 following:

17 (1) Projects to provide safe and sanitary dwellings for
18 sale or rent to low-income and moderate-income individuals or
19 families.

20 (2) Projects to increase the availability or quality of
21 housing for elderly persons.

22 (3) Projects to increase the availability or quality of
23 accessible housing for persons with disabilities.

24 (4) Projects to prevent or reduce homelessness.

25 (5) Projects to encourage the development and
26 rehabilitation of distressed neighborhoods.

27 (6) Projects to provide mortgage or rental assistance,
28 including housing counseling, foreclosure prevention and
29 refinancing products.

30 (7) Projects to provide loans, low-interest loans or

1 grants to low-income and moderate-income individuals or
2 families who are owner-occupants for repairs and improvement
3 to sustain or increase the conditions of the home.

4 (b) Purposes.--Money for projects under subsection (a) may
5 be used for the following:

6 (1) Predevelopment activities, including title searches,
7 market studies, project planning, architectural services,
8 legal and engineering studies and related fees.

9 (2) Acquisition and disposition of real or personal
10 property.

11 (3) Site preparation, including demolition of existing
12 structures and remediation of environmental conditions.

13 (4) Construction, reconstruction, alteration and repair
14 of existing structures, improvements and infrastructure.

15 (c) Matching funds.--~~Funds appropriated to the program~~ ←
16 PROGRAM FUNDS may be used for a set-aside for matching funds for ←
17 counties that have established optional county affordable
18 housing funds under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 60 (relating to optional
19 affordable housing funding). In order to receive matching funds
20 under this subsection, a county must annually report detailed
21 information as required by the agency on the use of the funds
22 for county projects. The information shall be included in the
23 agency's report under section 405-D.

24 (d) Limitation.--~~Funds appropriated to the program~~ PROGRAM ←
25 FUNDS shall not supplant existing resources dedicated to
26 affordable housing activities. ~~Funds appropriated to the program~~ ←
27 PROGRAM FUNDS may be used to support, expand and enhance other ←
28 programs administered by the agency.

29 (e) Preferences.--The agency may adopt written policies to
30 give preference to projects that meet specific goals, such as

energy efficiency, green building standards and comprehensive design strategies, or that target identified needs.

(f) Considerations.--The agency shall take into consideration geographical distribution of PROGRAM funds appropriated to the program to ensure that all areas of this Commonwealth participate to the greatest extent possible.

(g) Funding for housing program.--The agency shall make available 30% of the PROGRAM funds ~~appropriated~~ AVAILABLE under this article for housing programs benefiting households with household incomes which are less than 50% of the median area income.

Section 404-D. Plan.

(a) General rule.--Within 90 days of the effective date of this section and by March 15 of each year thereafter, the agency shall adopt a plan which establishes the agency's priorities for that year and sets forth the method in which ~~the~~ PROGRAM funds will be distributed that year.

(b) Publication.--The proposed plan, including a comment response document, shall be submitted to the chair and minority chair of the Urban Affairs and Housing Committee in the Senate and the chair and minority chair of the Commerce Committee in the House of Representatives, published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and published on the agency's Internet website for public comment no later than 45 days prior to its adoption under subsection (a). All comments submitted to the agency in writing shall be public records and shall be incorporated into the comment response document.

Section 405-D. Reporting.

Within 90 days following the close of the first calendar year after the effective date of this article and by July 1 of every

year thereafter, the agency shall issue a report containing a financial statement, an itemized list of projects funded and a description of other expenditures in the preceding calendar year. The report shall be submitted to the Governor, the Auditor General and the chair and minority chair of the Urban Affairs and Housing Committee in the Senate and the chair and minority chair of the Commerce Committee in the House of Representatives and published on the agency's Internet website. The report shall be a public record.

Section 406-D. Fund.

(a) Establishment.--There is established in the State Treasury the Housing Affordability and Rehabilitation Enhancement Fund. Interest and any other earnings in the fund shall remain in the fund. All ~~moneys allocated~~ PROGRAM FUNDS ALLOCATED OR APPROPRIATED to the program shall be deposited in the fund. ~~Moneys~~ PROGRAM FUNDS in the fund and the interest accruing thereon are hereby appropriated to the agency on a continuing basis to carry out the provisions of this article.

(b) Federal allocations.--All allocations distributed to and grants received by this Commonwealth from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development pursuant to the Housing Trust Fund, established in section 1338 of the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-289, 122 Stat. 2654), are deposited to the fund to be administered by the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency consistent with this article and applicable Federal law.

Section 407-D. Funding.

~~Implementation of this article is contingent upon sufficient funds being received from the Federal Government that are subsequently deposited in the fund in accordance with section~~

2 DEPOSITED IN THE FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 406-D to carry

5 which Congress fails to approve Federal funds or there are

8 until sufficient Federal funds are ~~appropriated~~ ALLOCATED TO THE ←
9 COMMONWEALTH, FUNDS ARE SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED BY THE GENERAL
10 ASSEMBLY OR FUNDS ARE PROVIDED BY A SOURCE OTHER THAN THE
11 COMMONWEALTH.

12 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
