## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for development of economic education and personal financial literacy programs; and establishing the Economic Education and Personal Financial Literacy Fund.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
12	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
13	section to read:
14	Section 1551. Economic Education and Personal Financial
15	Literacy Programs(a) The General Assembly declares it is the
16	purpose of this section to require the department to gather and
17	disseminate curriculum materials for school entities or private,

1	nonpublic, elementary or secondary schools in this Commonwealth
2	related to teaching economics and personal finance curriculum as
3	identified in the Pennsylvania Academic Standards for Economics,
4	Family and Consumer Science, and Career Education and Work. The
5	materials shall incorporate concepts of economics and personal
6	financial literacy into the K-12 school curricula and shall be
7	designed to educate the general student population who need to
8	understand our economic system and the role the individual
9	citizen, consumer and saver plays within that system. In
10	gathering materials for use in schools, the department shall
11	consider materials and resources currently available through
12	international, national, Statewide and local economic and
13	personal finance education organizations.
14	(b) The department shall have the power and its duty shall
15	<u>be to:</u>
16	(1) Provide resource information on economics, economic
17	education and personal financial literacy to educators and
18	public and private schools and organizations.
19	(2) Provide for the distribution, upon request, THROUGH THE
20	DEPARTMENT'S INTERNET WEBSITE to school entities or private,
21	nonpublic, elementary or secondary schools in this Commonwealth,
22	teacher curriculum materials and other available resources,
23	including economic education partnership programs, on economic
24	education and personal finance concepts. In distributing
25	materials and resources for use in schools, the department shall
26	consider those currently available through international,
27	national, Statewide and local economic, banking trade and
28	personal finance education organizations. Such materials may
29	include curriculum on issues related to our economic system,
30	including, but not limited to, the concepts identified in the

1	Pennsylvania Academic Standards for Economics, Family and
2	Consumer Science, and Career Education and Work.
3	(3) Identify AND recognize and establish awards for
4	Commonwealth schools that implement exemplary economic and
5	economic education and personal financial literacy curricula at
6	each benchmark identified by the Pennsylvania Academic Standards
7	for Economics, Family and Consumer Science, and Career Education
8	and Work.
9	(4) Maintain an inventory of economic education and personal
10	financial literacy materials, programs and resources available
11	in Commonwealth agencies.
12	(c) The secretary shall prepare and submit an annual report
13	to the Governor and the General Assembly on the status of
14	economic education and personal financial literacy programs in
15	this Commonwealth. The report shall outline economic education
16	and personal financial literacy programs and achievements,
17	highlight new initiatives and recommend future program needs.
18	(d) (1) The secretary shall consult, at least annually,
19	with a representative cross section of the economic, personal
20	financial literacy, banking and education communities of this
21	Commonwealth. The cross section shall include, but not be
22	limited to:
23	(i) Statewide and local economic and personal finance
24	education organizations.
25	(ii) Faculty and staff members of this Commonwealth's higher
26	education community, each of whom must have a background in or
27	knowledge of economics and personal financial literacy.
28	(iii) Teachers involved in economic education or personal
29	<u>financial literacy.</u>
30	(iv) Administrators of school entities who conduct an

1	economic or personal financial literacy education program.
2	(2) The consultation process shall:
3	(i) Assess the trends and needs in economic education and
4	personal financial literacy.
5	(ii) Consider the manner in which any funds are used to
6	support economic education and personal financial literacy
7	<u>activities.</u>
8	(iii) Make recommendations to the Governor and the General
9	Assembly regarding legislative or regulatory changes to improve
10	economic education and personal financial literacy, pursuant to
11	the preparation and submittal of the report required by
12	subsection (c).
13	(e) There is hereby established a separate fund in the State
14	Treasury to be known as the Economic Education and Personal
15	Financial Literacy Fund. The fund shall be administered by the
16	department, and all moneys in the fund are appropriated to the
17	department on a continuing basis. The moneys in the fund shall
18	be used solely for the purpose of implementing and continuing
19	the provisions of this section, including program
20	administration.
21	(1) The department is authorized, for purposes of
22	implementing and administering this section:
23	(i) To accept and expend, on behalf of the Commonwealth, any
24	appropriations from the General Assembly or Federal Government,
25	gifts, donations, legacies and usages of money from individuals,
26	organizations, public or private corporations and similar
27	entities.
28	(ii) To apply for, accept and expend any and all Federal,
29	State or other grants that may be available for the purposes of
30	this section.

1	<u>(iii) To pursue and establish partnerships with</u>
2	organizations, public and private corporations and similar
3	entities through which it may raise money for the purposes of
4	this section.
5	(2) All money received or raised under this subsection shall
6	be paid into the State Treasury and credited to the fund.
7	(f) The following words and phrases when used in this
8	section shall have the meanings given to them in this
9	subsection:
10	"Department." The Department of Education of the
11	Commonwealth.
12	"Fund." The Economic Education and Personal Financial
13	Literacy Fund.
14	"Personal financial literacy." The integration of various
15	factors relating to personal financial management, including
16	understanding financial institutions, using money, learning to
17	manage personal assets and liabilities, creating budgets and any
18	other factors that may assist an individual in this Commonwealth
19	to be financially responsible.
20	"School entity." A public school district, intermediate unit
21	or area vocational-technical school.
22	"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.

23 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
