## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), entitled "An 1 act relating to dentistry; defining and providing for the 2 licensing and registration of dentists and dental hygienists, 3 and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses and 4 registrations, subject to appeal, and for their 5 reinstatement; defining the powers and duties of the State 6 Dental Council and Examining Board and the Department of 7 Public Instruction; providing penalties; and repealing 8 existing laws," further defining "expanded function dental assistant"; further providing for the State Board of 9 10 Dentistry; and providing for scope of practice of expanded 11 function dental assistant. 12

13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

14 hereby enacts as follows:

15 Section 1. The definition of "expanded function dental

16 assistant" in section 2 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.

- 17 76), known as The Dental Law, added December 27, 1994 (P.L.1361,
- 18 No.160), is amended to read:

19 Section 2. Definitions.--\* \* \*

20 "Expanded Function Dental Assistant" means an individual who

holds a current valid certification under this act to perform 1 2 reversible intraoral procedures authorized by this act under the 3 direct supervision of a licensed dentist and under an assignment of duties by a dentist, as defined in section 11.8. [Such 4 procedures include, but are not limited to, placing and removing 5 6 rubber dams and matrices, placing and contouring amalgam and 7 other restorative materials and other reversible procedures not 8 designated by this act to be performed only by licensed dentists or dental hygienists. Expanded function dental assistants shall 9 10 not perform the following procedures:

11 (a) Complete or limited examination, diagnosis and treatment 12 planning.

13 (b) Surgical or cutting procedures of hard or soft tissue.

14 (c) Prescribing drugs, medicaments or work authorizations.

15 (d) Taking impressions other than for study models or 16 diagnostic casts.

(e) Final inspection and approval of restorative and other
treatment which affects occlusion and any necessary occlusal
adjustments.

20 (f) Performing pulp capping, pulpotomy and other endodontic 21 procedures.

(g) Placement and intraoral adjustments of fixed andremovable prosthetic appliances.

(h) Administration of local anesthesia, parenteral orinhalational sedation or general anesthesia.

Expanded function dental assistants shall perform under the direct supervision of a dentist. Direct supervision means that a dentist is in the dental office or treatment facility, personally diagnoses the condition to be treated, personally authorizes the procedure and remains in the dental office or

treatment facility while the procedure is being performed by the 1 2 expanded function dental assistant and, before dismissal of the 3 patient, evaluates the work performed by the expanded function dental assistant.] In addition, an expanded function dental 4 assistant may perform those procedures specified in section 5 11.10 and other reversible procedures not designated by this act\_ 6 7 to be performed by licensed dentists or dental hygienists. For purposes of this definition, "direct supervision" shall mean\_ 8 that a dentist is in the dental office or treatment facility, 9 10 personally diagnoses the condition to be treated, personally 11 authorizes the procedure and remains in the dental office or 12 treatment facility while the procedure is being performed and, 13 before dismissal of the patient, personally evaluates the work 14 performed.

Section 2. Section 2.1(a) of the act, added December 20, 17 1985 (P.L.513, No.118), is amended to read:

Section 2.1. State Board of Dentistry.--(a) The State Board 18 19 of Dentistry shall consist of the Secretary of Health, or his 20 designee, the Director of the Bureau of Consumer Protection in 21 the Office of the Attorney General, or his designee, the 22 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs and [ten] 23 twelve additional members, who shall be appointed by the 24 Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the 25 members elected to the Senate. Two members shall represent the 26 public at large. [Seven] Eight members shall have been licensed 27 and engaged in the actual practice of dentistry in this 28 Commonwealth during a period of not less than ten years 29 immediately preceding their appointment. One member shall be a dental hygienist licensed to practice dental hygiene in this 30

8	Dental Assistant(a) An expanded function dental assistant	
9	may perform the following procedures:	
10	(1) Placing and contouring amalgam and other restorative

12	(2) Perform coronal polishing.	
13	(3) Perform fluoride treatments, including fluoride varnish.	
14	(4) Take impressions of teeth for athletic appliances.	
15	(b) An expanded function dental assistant may not perform	
16	the following procedures:

18	planning.
