AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 commissions shall be determined," prohibiting the furlough of 20 21 Commonwealth employees.
- 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 23 hereby enacts as follows:
- 24 Section 1. Section 223 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 25 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by
- 26 adding a subsection to read:

- 1 Section 223. Payday. -- * * *
- 2 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if a general
- 3 appropriation act for a fiscal year is not enacted before the
- 4 beginning of that fiscal year, all employes of the Commonwealth
- 5 shall be considered to be critical and essential employes, shall
- 6 continue to be paid a biweekly salary in accordance with this
- 7 <u>section and may not be furloughed because of the failure to</u>
- 8 <u>enact a general appropriation act for a fiscal year. No employes</u>
- 9 of the Commonwealth shall be furloughed based on any
- 10 categorization or distinction not expressly provided for in law.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
