## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes, providing for special registration plates for
- 3 retired State troopers.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 1366. Special plates for retired State troopers.
- 9 Upon application of any person who is a retired State trooper
- 10 of the Pennsylvania State Police, the department shall issue to
- 11 <u>such person a special registration plate designating the vehicle</u>
- 12 <u>so registered as belonging to a person who is a retired State</u>
- 13 trooper. The plate design shall incorporate the colors of the
- 14 Pennsylvania State Police uniform: gray, black and gold. Across
- 15 the top of the plate shall be inscribed Pennsylvania. Across the
- 16 bottom of the plate shall be inscribed Retired State Trooper. To

- 1 the left of the plate number shall be inscribed the insignia of
- 2 the Pennsylvania State Police inset into a figure representing
- 3 the physical shape of Pennsylvania. The special registration
- 4 plate may be used only on a passenger car or truck with a
- 5 registered gross weight of not more than 10,000 pounds.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
