AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for drug delivery
- 3 resulting in death.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 2506(a) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 2506. Drug delivery resulting in death.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- A person commits [murder of the third
- 10 degree who] a felony of the first degree if the person
- 11 <u>intentionally</u>, <u>knowingly or recklessly</u> administers, dispenses,
- 12 delivers, gives, prescribes, sells or distributes any controlled
- 13 substance or counterfeit controlled substance in violation of
- 14 section 13(a)(14) or (30) of the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233,

- 1 No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
- 2 Cosmetic Act, and another person dies as a result of using the
- 3 substance.

- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
