4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 1366. In the Line of Duty plate.
9	(a) General ruleThe department shall design a special In
10	the Line of Duty registration plate. Upon application of a
11	family member of a police officer, fire or rescue personnel or
12	an emergency medical services worker who was killed while in the
13	line of duty, accompanied by a fee of \$20 which shall be in
14	addition to the annual registration fee and by such
15	documentation as the department shall require, the department
16	shall issue to the family member a special registration plate

1	designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a family
2	member of a person who was killed while in the line of duty. The
3	special registration plate may be used only on a passenger car
4	or truck with a registered gross weight of not more than 10,000
5	pounds.
6	(b) Documentation requiredAn applicant for an In the Line
7	of Duty plate shall certify on a form approved by the department
8	that the applicant is a family member of a person who was killed
9	while in the line of duty.
10	(c) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term "family
11	member" means any of the following persons related to a
12	decedent:
13	(1) Widow.
14	(2) Widower.
15	(3) Mother.
16	(4) Father.
17	(5) Stepmother.
18	(6) Stepfather.
19	(7) Mother through adoption.
20	(8) Father through adoption.
