AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 3 fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for certain 4 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 5 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009; to provide appropriations from the 7 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 8 Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores 9 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust 10 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the 11 12 Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology 13 Development Authority Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 14 15 the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 17 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 18 for the fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for the 19 proper operation of the several departments of the 20 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to-21 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the-22 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 23 the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining 25 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009. 26 TO PROVIDE FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE 27 EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE 28 COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE 29 FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2009, TO JUNE 30, 2010, FOR CERTAIN 30 INSTITUTIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS 31 INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR 32 ENDING JUNE 30, 2009; TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE 33 STATE LOTTERY FUND, THE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND ASSISTANCE

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- 10 be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2009.
- 11 Section 102. Definitions. The following words and phrases
- 12 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in

- 14 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 15 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant

- 21 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding-
- 22 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 23 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 24 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
- 25 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
- 26 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
- 27 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 28 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 29 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on

- 1 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 2 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment-
- 3 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 4 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 5 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 6 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 7 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 8 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 9 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 10 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 11 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 12 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 13 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall-
- 14 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
- 15 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside-
- 16 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution
- 17 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State-
- 18 medical assistance program.

- 25 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as-

- 1 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. The
- 2 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this-
- 3 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 4 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to-
- 5 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive-
- 6 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses
- 7 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for
- 8 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, and for the payment of
- 9 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal
- 10 year ending June 30, 2009. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 11 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal-
- 12 year.
- 13 Section 106. Block grants. (a) Appropriation. -- The-
- 14 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 15 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
- 16 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 17 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes-
- 18 and under the restrictions for which the funds are provided for
- 19 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009.
- 20 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. The Small
- 21 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small-
- 22 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 23 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 24 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet-
- 25 community development needs.
- 26 (c) Community Services Block Grant. The Community Services
- 27 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 28 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on-
- 29 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the-
- 30 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In-

- 1 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old-
- 2 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements-
- 3 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to-
- 4 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 5 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. The
- 6 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 7 for the provision of preventive health and other health services-
- 8 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 9 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health-
- 10 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic-
- 11 violence services.
- 12 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. The
- 13 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 14 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 15 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
- 16 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 17 special health care needs and in providing health services for
- 18 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health-
