AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 5 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 18 19 20 commissions shall be determined," providing for general appropriation bill time line. 21

22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

23 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a section to read:

1	<u>Section 613.1. General Appropriation Bill Time Line(a)</u>
2	(1) A member of the majority party of the House of
3	Representatives shall introduce a general appropriation bill for
4	<u>a fiscal year no later than March 31 of the immediately</u>
5	preceding fiscal year.
6	(2) The House of Representatives shall pass a general
7	appropriation bill for a fiscal year no later than April 30 of
8	the immediately preceding fiscal year.
9	(3) If the House of Representatives fails to meet the
10	deadline established by paragraph (2), neither the House of
11	Representatives nor any of its officers or members may enter
12	into any contract or award any grant between May 1 and the date
13	on which the House of Representatives passes a general
14	appropriation bill.
15	(b) (1) The Senate shall pass a general appropriation bill
16	for a fiscal year no later than May 30 of the immediately
17	preceding fiscal year.
18	(2) If the Senate fails to meet the deadline established by
19	paragraph (1), neither the Senate nor any of its officers or
20	members may enter into any contract or award any grant between
21	June 1 and the date on which the Senate passes a general
22	appropriation bill.
23	(c) If the Governor fails to approve a general appropriation
24	bill for a fiscal year in accordance with section 15 of Article
25	IV of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, or fails to partially
26	disapprove a general appropriation bill for a fiscal year in
27	accordance with section 16 of Article IV of the Constitution of
28	Pennsylvania on or prior to June 30 of the immediately preceding
29	fiscal year, the following shall apply:
30	(1) The Senate and any of its officers or members, the House

1	of Representatives and any of its officers or members, and any	
2	agency of the Commonwealth under the Governor's jurisdiction may	
3	not enter into any contract or award any grant between July 1	
4	and the date on which the Governor approves or partially	
5	disapproves the general appropriation bill.	
6	(2) The Senate and the House of Representatives shall be	
7	called into session each day between July 1 and the date on	
8	which the Governor approves or partially disapproves the general	
9	appropriation bill.	
10	(d) In the event that a member of the majority caucus of the	
11	Senate introduces a general appropriation bill and the Senate	
12	passes a general appropriation bill prior to May 1 and before	
13	the House passes a general appropriation bill, the provisions of	
14	subsection (a), which prohibit the House of Representatives and	
15	its officers and members from entering into contracts and	
16	awarding grants, shall not apply and the deadline established	
17	and the prohibition specified in subsection (b) shall apply to	
18	the House of Representatives and its officers and members.	
19	(e) The following words and phrases used in this section	
20	shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless	
21	the context clearly indicates otherwise:	
22	"Contract" means a type of written agreement, regardless of	
23	what it may be called, for the procurement or disposal of	
24	supplies, services or construction and executed by all parties	
25	in accordance with the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950,	
26	No.164), known as the "Commonwealth Attorneys Act."	
27	"General appropriation bill" means a bill introduced in	
28	either the Senate or the House of Representatives that provides	
29	for the General Appropriation Act for the fiscal year commencing	
30	after the fiscal year in which the bill is introduced.	
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- 1 <u>"Grant" means the furnishing of assistance by the</u>
- 2 <u>Commonwealth or any person</u>, whether financial or otherwise, to
- 3 <u>any person to support a program.</u>
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
