A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 25 through 31, 2009, as "National Massage Therapy Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Governor Rendell approved and signed Act 118, the
- 4 Massage Therapy Law, on October 9, 2008; and
- 5 WHEREAS, This law established the Massage Therapy Board and
- 6 provided for the licensure of massage therapists in
- 7 Pennsylvania; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The American Massage Therapy Association (AMTA), a
- 9 58,000-member professional association for massage therapists,
- 10 educates consumers and professionals on the benefits of massage
- 11 therapy and assists people nationwide in locating qualified
- 12 massage therapists in their communities; and
- WHEREAS, According to the AMTA, today there are 91,000
- 14 nationally certified massage therapists and more than 300
- 15 accredited massage schools and programs nationwide; and

- 1 WHEREAS, In the past five years an average of 32% of adult
- 2 Americans received a massage; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Almost one-third of these recipients did so to
- 4 improve their overall wellness, as well as to assist in the
- 5 treatment of pain management, injury rehabilitation and migraine
- 6 control; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 8 week of October 25 through 31, 2009, as "National Massage
- 9 Therapy Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
