AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 1 2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for certain 4 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 5 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 6 7 ending June 30, 2009; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 8 9 Fund, the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk 10 Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency 11 Medical Services Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, 12 the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, 13 the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund and 14 the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the Executive Department; to 15 16 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 17 18 fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal 19 year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the 20 21 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License 22 Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal 23 funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for 24 25 the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009; to provide for the 26 27 additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the General Fund, from the State Lottery Fund and from the 28 29 Tobacco Settlement Fund for the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 30 31 32 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008; and making interfund transfers for the fiscal year July 1, 33 34 2008, to June 30, 2009.

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- 22 hereby enacts as follows:

- 24 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 25 Section 101. Short title. -- This act shall be known and may
- 26 be cited as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 2009.
- 27 Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases
- 28 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in
- 29 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 7 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 8 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 9 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 10 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
- 11 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
- 12 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
- 13 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 14 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 15 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
- 16 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 17 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 18 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 19 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 20 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 21 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 22 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 23 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 24 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 25 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 26 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 27 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 28 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
- 29 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
- 30 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside

- 1 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution
- 2 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
- 3 medical assistance program.

- 29 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the
- 30 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of

- 1 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary
- 2 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities
- 3 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year
- 4 beginning July 1, 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred
- 5 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June

- 28 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as

- 13 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 14 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.
- 15 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following
- 16 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 17 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the
- 18 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the
- 19 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the
- 20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, and for the payment of bills
- 21 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
- 22 ending June 30, 2009.
- 23 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund. -- The following sums
- 24 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
- 25 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material
- 26 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the
- 27 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees
- 28 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 29 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 30 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct

- 1 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes

- 5 (j) Milk Marketing Fund. -- The following sums set forth in

- 8 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
- 9 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 10 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 11 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 12 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 13 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as

- 11 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 12 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as

- 25 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 26 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 27 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 28 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 29 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

- 6 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 7 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 8 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 9 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 10 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
- 11 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 12 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 13 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 14 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 15 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.
- 16 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. -- The
- 17 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this
- 18 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 19 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to
- 20 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive
- 21 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses
- 22 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for
- 23 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009, and for the payment of
- 24 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal
- 25 year ending June 30, 2009. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 26 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal
- 27 year.
- 28 Section 106. Block grants. -- (a) Appropriation. -- The
- 29 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 30 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the

- 1 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 2 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes
- 3 and under the restrictions for which the funds are provided for
- 4 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009.
- 5 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. -- The Small
- 6 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 7 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 8 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 9 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
- 10 community development needs.
- 11 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services
- 12 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 13 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 14 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 15 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 16 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 17 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 18 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 19 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 20 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 21 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 22 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 23 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 24 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
- 25 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
- 26 violence services.
- 27 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 28 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 29 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 30 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for

- 1 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 2 special health care needs and in providing health services for
- 3 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
- 4 care.
- 5 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-
- 6 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
- 7 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
- 8 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
- 9 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds
- 10 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds
- 11 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
- 12 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.
- 13 (g) Social Services Block Grant. -- The Social Services Block
- 14 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
- 15 persons.
- 16 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant. -- The Mental Health
- 17 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
- 18 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
- 19 serious emotional disturbance.
- 20 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant. -- The Substance Abuse Block
- 21 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
- 22 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.
- 23 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant. -- The Child
- 24 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the
- 25 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and
- 26 availability of child care for low-income families.
- 27 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--
- 28 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
- 29 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
- 30 training and support services, child welfare and administration
