## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 2 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 3 fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for certain 4 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills <del>incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year</del> 6 ending June 30, 2009; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 8 Fund, the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account, the Hazardous 9 Material Response Fund, The State Stores Fund, the Milk 10 Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency 11 Medical Services Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, 12 the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, 13 the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund and 14 15 the Tobacco Settlement Fund to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System 16 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the 17 fiscal year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010; to provide 18 appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal 19 year July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2010, for the proper operation 20 of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the 21 22 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal 23 funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for-24 25 the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009; to provide for the 26 additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the 27 General Fund, from the State Lottery Fund and from the 28 Tobacco Settlement Fund for the Executive Department of the 29 Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2008 to June 30, 30 2009, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining 31 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008; 32 and making interfund transfers for the fiscal year July 1, 33 2008, to June 30, 2009. 34

TO PROVIDE FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE 3 FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2009, TO JUNE 30, 2010, FOR CERTAIN 4 INSTITUTIONS AND ORGANIZATIONS, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS 5 INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR 7 ENDING JUNE 30, 2009; TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE STATE LOTTERY FUND, THE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND ASSISTANCE 8 9 FUND, THE AVIATION RESTRICTED REVENUE ACCOUNT, THE HAZARDOUS MATERIAL RESPONSE FUND, THE STATE STORES FUND, THE MILK 10 MARKETING FUND, THE HOME INVESTMENT TRUST FUND, THE EMERGENCY 11 MEDICAL SERVICES OPERATING FUND, THE TUITION PAYMENT FUND, 12 THE BANKING DEPARTMENT FUND, THE FIREARM RECORDS CHECK FUND, 13 THE BEN FRANKLIN TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FUND AND 14 15 THE TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE JUDICIAL COMPUTER SYSTEM 16 AUGMENTATION ACCOUNT TO THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT FOR THE 17 FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2009, TO JUNE 30, 2010; TO PROVIDE 18 APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE MOTOR LICENSE FUND FOR THE FISCAL 19 YEAR JULY 1, 2009, TO JUNE 30, 2010, FOR THE PROPER OPERATION 20 OF THE SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND THE 21 PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE AUTHORIZED TO SPEND MOTOR LICENSE 22 FUND MONEYS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL 23 FUNDS TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND FOR 24 25 THE PAYMENT OF BILLS REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2009; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 26 ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL AND STATE FUNDS FROM THE 27 GENERAL FUND, FROM THE STATE LOTTERY FUND AND FROM THE 28 TOBACCO SETTLEMENT FUND FOR THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE 29 COMMONWEALTH FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2008 TO JUNE 30, 30 2009, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING 31 UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2008; 32 AND MAKING INTERFUND TRANSFERS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 33 34 2008, TO JUNE 30, 2009. 35 TABLE OF CONTENTS 36 PART I. - 13 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small-
- 14 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
