A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing May 12, 2009, as "Colorectal Cancer Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of
- 4 cancer deaths among men and women in this Commonwealth; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2008 physicians diagnosed an estimated 7,560 new
- 6 cases of colorectal cancer in this Commonwealth and the disease
- 7 killed more than 2,500 individuals; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer incidence and mortality rates in
- 9 this Commonwealth are higher than the national average; and
- 10 WHEREAS, If citizens 50 years of age or older would have
- 11 regular colorectal cancer screening tests, at least one-third of
- 12 colorectal cancer deaths could be prevented each year due to
- 13 early detection; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer can almost always be cured if
- 15 detected in its early stages with regular screening tests to
- 16 detect colon polyps before they become cancerous, saving lives

- 1 and reducing mortality both by decreasing incidence and by
- 2 detecting a higher proportion of cancer at early, more treatable
- 3 stages; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Education can help inform the public of methods of
- 5 prevention and symptoms of early detection, and May 12, 2009, is
- 6 the day for consumer education to promote colorectal cancer
- 7 awareness in this Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize May 12, 2009, as
- 9 "Colorectal Cancer Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
