7	Section 1. Section 2506(a) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
9	§ 2506. Drug delivery resulting in death.
10	(a) General ruleA person commits [murder of the third
11	degree who] <u>a felony of the first degree if the person</u>
12	intentionally, knowingly or recklessly administers, dispenses,
13	delivers, gives, prescribes, sells or distributes any controlled
14	substance or counterfeit controlled substance in violation of
15	section 13(a)(14) or (30) of the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233,

No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
Cosmetic Act, and another person dies as a result of using the
substance.
