 companies and volunteer services in the areas of scope,
 administration, programs, expiration of authority and special
 provisions; PROVIDING FOR GRANTS TO VOLUNTEER QUICK RESPONSE
 SERVICES; and making a related repeal.

- 16 § 7814. Consolidation incentive.
- 17 If, after July 31, 2003, two or more volunteer fire companies
- 18 consolidate their use of facilities, equipment, firefighters and
- 19 services, the consolidated entity may, upon notification of the
- 20 [agency] commissioner, be eliqible for a reduction of the
- 21 interest rate payable on any outstanding principal balance owed,
- 22 as of the date of consolidation, by any or all of the
- 23 consolidating companies to the Volunteer Companies Loan Fund for
- 24 loans made under the act of July 15, 1976 (P.L.1036, No.208),
- 25 known as the Volunteer Fire Company, Ambulance Service and
- 26 Rescue Squad Assistance Act, or under Subchapter E of Chapter 73

- 29 payable shall be from 2% to 1%. Upon receipt of such

- (1) Within 30 days of June 28, 2007, for the fiscal years commencing July 1, 2006, and July 1, 2007, and by September 1 of each year thereafter, the [agency] commissioner shall provide written instructions for grants under this chapter to the president of every volunteer

ambulance service in this Commonwealth.

- 12 Within 45 days of the effective date of June 28, 13 2007, for the fiscal years commencing July 1, 2006, and July 14 1, 2007, and by September 8 of each year, the [agency] 15 commissioner shall provide applications to the president of 16 every volunteer ambulance service.
