AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 15 16 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined," providing for automobile 20 21 restriction.

- 24 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
- 25 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 26 section to read:

- 1 <u>Section 515.1. Automobile Restriction.--(a) Except as</u>
- 2 <u>otherwise provided by executive order of the Governor or to</u>
- 3 address issues of public safety, no executive-level State
- 4 employe shall accept or make use of an automobile purchased or
- 5 leased with Commonwealth funds.
- 6 (b) For purposes of this subsection, the term "executive-
- 7 <u>level State employe" shall include cabinet members, deputy</u>
- 8 <u>secretaries</u>, <u>employes of the Governor's Office</u>, <u>employes of the</u>
- 9 Lieutenant Governor's Office and any State employe with
- 10 discretionary powers which may affect the outcome of a State
- 11 <u>agency's regulatory or licensing decisions.</u>
- 12 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
