AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 1 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 4 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 17 further providing for general powers of the board, for specific subjects on which board may adopt regulations and 18 for management of Pennsylvania Liquor Stores; and making a 19 20 repeal. 21 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

22 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 207(f) and (h) of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14), is amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: Section 207. General Powers of Board.--Under this act, the 1 board shall have the power and its duty shall be:

2 * * *

3 (f) To appoint, fix the compensation and define the powers and duties of such managers, officers, inspectors, examiners, 4 5 clerks and other employes as shall be required for the operation of this act, [subject to the provisions of The Administrative 6 7 Code of 1929 and the Civil Service Act] who shall serve at the 8 board's pleasure. An employe of the board shall be considered a State employe for purposes of 71 Pa.C.S. Pt. XXV (relating to 9 retirement for State employees and officers). The board shall 10 establish a system of classification and compensation of its 11 12 employes and shall not be subject to the provisions of the act 13 of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative 14 Code of 1929, as to classification and compensation for its employes, and shall conduct its activities consistent with the 15 16 practices and procedures of Commonwealth agencies.

17 * * *

18 (h) Without in any way limiting or being limited by the foregoing, to do all such things and perform all such acts as 19 20 are deemed necessary or advisable for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this act and the regulations made 21 thereunder. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 22 23 contrary, the board is authorized to purchase all goods and 24 services in its sole discretion which are deemed necessary to perform all such acts. The board is authorized to promulgate 25 26 regulations providing for the procurement of such goods and 27 services. * * * 28

29 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
30 contrary, to enter into agreements with governmental units of

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1 this Commonwealth and other states for the purchase or sale of 2 goods and/or services with, from or to the governmental units. 3 Section 2. Section 208(c) of the act is amended to read: 4 Section 208. Specific Subjects on Which Board May Adopt 5 Regulations.--Subject to the provisions of this act and without 6 limiting the general power conferred by the preceding section, 7 the board may make regulations regarding:

9 (c) The purchase, as provided in this act, of liquor and 10 alcohol, and its supply to Pennsylvania Liquor Stores <u>and the</u> 11 <u>procurement of all other goods and services which are deemed</u> 12 <u>necessary by the board, in its sole discretion, to perform all</u> 13 <u>such acts</u>.

15 Section 3. Section 302 of the act is repealed:

16 [Section 302. Selection of Personnel.--Officers and employes 17 of the board, except as herein otherwise provided, shall be 18 appointed and employed subject to the provisions of the Civil 19 Service Act.]

20 Section 4. Section 303 of the act is amended to read: 21 Section 303. Management of Pennsylvania Liquor Stores .--Every Pennsylvania Liquor Store shall be conducted by a person 22 23 appointed [in the manner provided in the Civil Service Act] by 24 the board who shall be known as the "manager" and who shall, 25 under the directions of the board, be responsible for carrying 26 out the provisions of this act and the regulations adopted by 27 the board under this act as far as they relate to the conduct of 28 such stores.

29 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
