AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for restricted
- 3 activities.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1103(j) of Title 65 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 1103. Restricted activities.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (j) Voting conflict.--
- 11 (1) Where voting conflicts are not otherwise addressed
- by the Constitution of Pennsylvania or by any law, rule,
- 13 regulation, order or ordinance, the following procedure shall
- 14 be employed. Any public official or public employee who in
- 15 the discharge of his official duties would be required to
- 16 vote on a matter that would result in a conflict of interest
- shall abstain from voting and, prior to the vote being taken,
- 18 publicly announce and disclose the nature of his interest as

1 a public record in a written memorandum filed with the person 2 responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting at which 3 the vote is taken[, provided that whenever a governing body would be unable to take any action on a matter before it 4 5 because the number of members of the body required to abstain 6 from voting under the provisions of this section makes the 7 majority or other legally required vote of approval 8 unattainable, then such members shall be permitted to vote if 9 disclosures are made as otherwise provided herein. In the 10 case of a three-member governing body of a political subdivision, where one member has abstained from voting as a 11 12 result of a conflict of interest and the remaining two 13 members of the governing body have cast opposing votes, the 14 member who has abstained shall be permitted to vote to break 15 the tie vote if disclosure is made as otherwise provided 16 herein].

- (2) If a governing body would be unable to take any action on a matter before it because the number of members of the body required to abstain from voting under this section makes the majority or other legally required vote of approval unattainable or if, in the case of a three-member governing body of a political subdivision, where one member has abstained from voting as a result of a conflict of interest and the remaining two members of the governing body have cast opposing votes, the governing body shall, immediately after disclosure of the conflict of interest by the member, appoint alternate members as follows:
- 28 <u>(i) If the appointment of alternate members is</u>
 29 <u>provided for by law, the appointment shall be made</u>
 30 according to that law.

2	provided for by law, the appointment shall be made by the
3	chairperson of the governing body.
4	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
