10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Section 3(e)(12) of the act of November 30, 2004
12	(P.L.1672, No.213), known as the Alternative Energy Portfolio
13	Standards Act, added July 17, 2007 (P.L.114, No.35), is amended

15	Section 3. Alternative energy portfolio standards.

17	(e) Alternative energy credits
18	* * *
19	(12) Unless a contractual provision explicitly assigns

alternative energy credits in a different manner, the owner 1 2 of the alternative energy system or a customer-generator owns 3 any and all alternative energy credits associated with or created by the production of electric energy by such facility 4 or customer, and the owner or customer shall be entitled to 5 sell, transfer or take any other action to which a legal 6 7 owner of property is entitled to take with respect to the 8 credits. The following apply: 9 (i) This paragraph shall apply to alternative energy

10 credits established under this act, whether or not already deemed transferred, unless the alternative energy 11 credits were specifically transferred by explicit 12 13 contractual provision by the alternative energy system or 14 customer-generator. From the effective date of this 15 subparagraph, alternative energy credits may not be considered owned by another entity other than the 16 17 alternative energy system or a customer-generator until the alternative energy source enters into an agreement 18 19 specifically conveying the alternative energy credits to

20 <u>some other entity, regardless of when an underlying</u>

21 <u>contract for the purchase of electric energy or other</u>

22 products from the generator that qualifies as an

23 <u>alternative energy system was executed.</u>

24 (ii) Subparagraph (i) shall apply on or after the
25 effective date of this subparagraph regardless of when an
26 underlying contract for the purchase of electric energy
27 or other products from the generator that qualifies as an
28 alternative energy system was executed.

30 Section 2. Section 3.1 of the act of July 17, 2007 (P.L.114,

No.35), entitled "An act amending the act of November 30, 2004 1 (P.L.1672, No.213), entitled, 'An act providing for the sale of 2 3 electric energy generated from renewable and environmentally beneficial sources, for the acquisition of electric energy 4 generated from renewable and environmentally beneficial sources 5 by electric distribution and supply companies and for the powers 6 and duties of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission,' 7 8 further providing for the definitions of 'alternative energy credit,' 'customer-generator,' 'force majeure,' 'net metering' 9 10 and 'Tier I alternative energy source,' for alternative energy portfolio standards, for portfolio requirements in other states 11 and for interconnection standards for customer-generator 12 13 facilities" is repealed.

14 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
