AN ACT

Amending the act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, No.3), entitled "An 1 act to promote the general welfare and stimulate the economy 2 of the Commonwealth by requiring that all public bodies, including the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, and all authorities, include in all contracts for construction, 5 reconstruction, alteration, repair, improvement or 6 maintenance of improvements of a permanent or temporary 7 nature, a provision that if any steel products are to be used 9 in the performance of the contract only steel products produced in the United States shall be used, and imposing 10 liability for violation of this act," further providing for 11 required contract provisions. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 4 of the act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, 16 No.3), known as the Steel Products Procurement Act, is amended 17 to read: Section 4. (a) Every public agency shall require that every 18 19 contract document for the construction, reconstruction, 20 alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works 21 contain a provision that, if any steel products are to be used

or supplied in the performance of the contract, only steel

- 1 products as herein defined shall be used or supplied in the
- 2 performance of the contract or any subcontracts thereunder.
- 3 (b) This section shall not apply in any case where:
- 4 (1) the head of the public agency, in writing, determines
- 5 that steel products as herein defined are not produced in the
- 6 United States in sufficient quantities to meet the requirements
- 7 of the contract[.];
- 8 (2) a list of exempt steel products, which has been
- 9 <u>identified by the Department of General Services as not produced</u>
- 10 in the United States in sufficient quantities in the previous
- 11 <u>calendar year, is published on the department's Internet</u>
- 12 <u>website</u>, <u>which contractors</u>, <u>subcontractors</u>, <u>suppliers</u>, <u>bidders</u>,
- 13 offerors and public agencies can rely upon in preparing bids and
- 14 contracts. The list of exempt products shall be updated annually
- 15 on a date selected by the Department of General Services. The
- 16 Department of General Services may not make changes to the list
- 17 during the year following publication.
- 18 (c) The General Assembly under section 11 of Article I of
- 19 the Constitution of Pennsylvania reaffirms sovereign immunity,
- 20 and no provision of this section shall constitute a waiver of
- 21 sovereign immunity for the purpose of 1 Pa.C.S. § 2310 (relating
- 22 to sovereign immunity reaffirmed; specific waiver) or otherwise.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
