| 13 | shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the |
| 14 | context clearly indicates otherwise: |
| 15 | "Commercial sex." Any sexual activity, including sexual |
| 16 | intercourse, deviate sexual intercourse or indecent contact, in |
| 17 | which anything of value is given to or received by another |

person. The term includes prostitution, participation in the production of pornography and performance in strip clubs and sexual activity induced by force, fraud or coercion, either express of implied, regardless of the age of the victim. * * *

6 Section 2. Section 3002 of Title 18 is amended to read:7 § 3002. Trafficking of persons.

8 (a) Offense defined.--A person commits [an offense] <u>the</u> 9 <u>offense of trafficking in persons</u> if the person knowingly 10 traffics or knowingly attempts to traffic another person, 11 knowing that the other person will be subjected to forced labor 12 or services <u>or commercial sex</u>.

(b) Grading.--An offense under subsection (a) shall be graded a felony of the second degree unless the other person suffers bodily injury or the other person is an individual under 18 years of age, whether or not the person is aware of the age of the other person, in which case it shall be graded as a felony of the first degree.

21 (a) Offense defined.--A parent of a minor commits an offense

22 if the parent sells or otherwise transfers custody or control of

23 the minor or offers to sell or otherwise transfer custody of the

24 minor with knowledge that as a consequence of the sale or

25 transfer, the minor will engage in commercial sex acts.

26 (b) Grading.--An offense under subsection (a) constitutes a

27 <u>felony of the second degree.</u>
