## AN ACT

- Providing for a temporary moratorium of court-ordered countywide reassessments and for reforms based upon study.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Property Tax
- 7 Reassessment Moratorium Act.
- 8 Section 2. Findings and purpose.
- 9 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 10 (1) The method of property tax assessment in this
- 11 Commonwealth is fragmented and in need of reform.
- 12 (2) The current method provides for little uniformity
- 13 between counties resulting in vast inequities of property
- assessments across this Commonwealth.
- 15 (3) Further, the tax assessment system provides little
- 16 protection for homeowners who experience sudden and dramatic
- increases in their property assessments as a result of a

- 1 countywide assessment.
- 2 (4) Failure to address the problem has led to the 3 potential for devastating tax increases that would be harmful 4 to the citizens and economic well-being of this Commonwealth.
- 5 (5) A study was conducted of the Commonwealth's property 6 assessment system.
  - (6) The study addressed the proper policies and procedures necessary to ensure uniformity among counties and a comparative analysis of the property assessment systems in other states.
- 11 (7) The study concluded that changes are needed and the 12 General Assembly should enact legislation to address issues 13 raised by the study.
- 14 Section 3. Definitions.

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- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 16 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the-
- 17 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 18 "Local taxing authority." Any political subdivision-
- 19 authorized to impose real property taxes.
- 20 Section 4 3. Moratorium.
- 21 (a) Prohibition.--No <del>local taxing authority may</del> COURT SHALL

- 22 ORDER, AND NO COUNTY SHALL undertake, on or after the effective
- 23 date of this section, the process of a <del>court-ordered</del> countywide
- 24 reassessment of real property for purposes of levying property
- 25 taxes; however, counties currently conducting a court-ordered
- 26 countywide reassessment as of the effective date of this section
- 27 may, at the discretion of the county, continue the process
- 28 PETITION THE COURT TO DELAY THE PROCESS UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE
- 29 CONDITIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) HAVE BEEN MET.
- 30 (b) End of prohibition. -- The prohibition under subsection

- 1 (a) shall remain in effect until the General Assembly has
- 2 enacted legislation to address the declarations contained in
- 3 section 2(1), (2), (3) and (4) or until December 31, 2013,
- 4 whichever comes first.
- 5 Section  $\frac{5}{4}$ . Effective date.
- 6 This act shall take effect immediately.
