## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in charter schools, further providing for annual reports and assessments; and providing for multiple charter school organization.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 1728-A(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, added
12	June 19, 1997 (P.L.225, No.22), is amended and the section is
13	amended by adding a subsection to read:
14	Section 1728-A. Annual Reports and Assessments(a) [The]
15	Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (d), the local
16	board of school directors shall annually assess whether each
17	charter school is meeting the goals of its charter and shall
18	conduct a comprehensive review prior to granting a five (5) year
19	renewal of the charter. The local board of school directors
20	shall have ongoing access to the records and facilities of the

charter school to ensure that the charter school is in
compliance with its charter and this act and that requirements
for testing, civil rights and student health and safety are
being met.

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(d) (1) The department shall annually assess whether each 6 7 multiple charter school organization is meeting the goals of its charter and shall conduct a comprehensive review prior to 8 9 granting a five (5) year renewal of the multiple charter school 10 organization's charter. The department shall request any records 11 and information necessary to ensure the multiple charter school 12 organization is in compliance with its charter and this article. (2) Each multiple charter school organization shall submit 13 14 an annual report to the department no later than August 1 of 15 each year in a form prescribed by the secretary. 16 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 17 Section 1733-A. Multiple Charter School Organization.--(a) 18 (1) Two or more charter schools may merge or consolidate under 19 15 Pa.C.S. Pt. II Subpt. C (relating to nonprofit corporations) 20 into a multiple charter school organization. 21 (2) The multiple charter school organization shall be 22 granted a single charter to operate two or more individual 23 charter schools under the oversight of a single board of 24 trustees and a chief executive officer who shall oversee and 25 manage the operation of the individual charter schools under its 26 organization. 27 (3) The multiple charter school organization shall be 28 considered a charter school and shall be subject to all of the 29 requirements of this article unless otherwise provided for under this section. 30

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1	(4) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect or
2	change the terms or conditions of any individual charter
3	previously granted that is consolidated under this section.
4	(b) The department shall develop and issue a standard
5	application form for multiple charter school organization
6	applicants which shall contain the following information:
7	(1) The identification of the multiple charter school
8	organization.
9	(2) The names of the charter schools seeking merger or
10	consolidation under subsection (a).
11	(3) An organization chart that clearly presents the proposed
12	governance structure of the multiple charter school
13	organization, including lines of authority and reporting between
14	the board of trustees, chief executive officer, administrators,
15	staff and any educational management service provider that will
16	play a role in providing management services to the charter
17	schools under its jurisdiction.
18	(4) A clear description of the roles and responsibilities
19	for the board of trustees, chief executive officer,
20	administrators and any other entities, including a charter
21	school foundation, shown in the organization chart.
22	(5) A clear description and method for the appointment or
23	election of members of the board of trustees.
24	(6) Standards for board performance, including compliance
25	with all applicable laws, regulations and terms of the charter.
26	(7) Enrollment procedures for each individual charter school
27	included in its charter.
28	(8) Any other information as deemed necessary by the
29	<u>department.</u>
30	(c) (1) The board of trustees of each charter school shall
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1	jointly submit their application for consolidation into a
2	multiple charter school organization to the department for
3	review.
4	(2) Upon receipt of the multiple charter school organization
5	application and all necessary documentation as required under
6	subsection (b), the secretary shall, within 30 days, approve or
7	deny the application.
8	(3) Written notice of the secretary's action shall be sent
9	to the applicants and the appeal board. If the application is
10	denied, the reasons for the denial shall be included in the
11	written notice.
12	(4) (i) At the option of the multiple charter school
13	organization applicants, the decision of the secretary may be
14	appealed to the appeal board.
15	(ii) The appeal board shall, within 30 days, approve or deny
16	the appeal. If the appeal board has affirmed the decision of the
17	secretary, notice shall be provided to both parties.
18	(iii) A decision of the appeal board to reverse the decision
19	of the secretary shall serve as a requirement for the secretary
20	to grant the application and sign the multiple charter school
21	organization charter.
22	(iv) A decision of the appeal board shall be subject to
23	appellate review by the Commonwealth Court.
24	(5) The multiple charter school organization's charter term
25	shall remain in effect until the time of expiration pursuant to
26	section 1720-A, at which time the department shall conduct a
27	comprehensive review prior to granting a charter renewal
28	pursuant to section 1728-A.
29	(d) A multiple charter school organization may:
30	(1) Participate in the assessment systems in the same manner
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1	in which a school district participates, and its individual
2	charter schools shall participate in such assessment systems in
3	the same manner as individual schools in school districts. All
4	data gathered for purposes of evaluation shall be gathered in a
5	<u>like manner.</u>
6	(2) Add charter schools to its organization through the
7	application process included under this section.
8	(3) Allow students enrolled in an individual charter school
9	to matriculate to another individual charter school under its
10	oversight so as to complete a course of instruction in an
11	educational institution from kindergarten through grade 12.
12	(e) Annual reportsThe annual report required under
13	section 1728-A shall be provided by the board of trustees and
14	chief executive officer of the multiple charter school
15	organization and shall include all information required to
16	provide a basis for evaluation for renewal of each individual
17	charter school under the organization's oversight.
18	(f) (1) A multiple charter school organization shall be
19	regarded as the holder of the charter of each individual charter
20	school under its oversight and each such previously or
21	subsequently awarded charter shall be subject to nonrenewal or
22	revocation in accordance with this article.
23	(2) The nonrenewal or revocation shall not affect the status
24	of a charter awarded for any other individual charter school
25	<u>under its oversight.</u>
26	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
