AN ACT

1 Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937
 2 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of
 3 unemployment compensation to be administered by the
 4 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly
 5 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions)
 6 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to
 7 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay
 8 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the
 9 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons;
 10 providing procedure and administrative details for the
 11 determination, payment and collection of such contributions
 12 and the payment of such compensation; providing for
 13 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies;
 14 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State
 15 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," further providing for
 16 qualifications required to secure compensation.

17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 18 hereby enacts as follows:

19 Section 1. Section 401 of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd
 20 Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment
 21 Compensation Law, is amended by adding a subsection to read:

22 Section 401. Qualifications Required to Secure
 23 Compensation.--Compensation shall be payable to any employe who

1 is or becomes unemployed, and who--

2 * * *

3 (h) Had been employed by a separating employer for a minimum
4 of thirty (30) days. For the purposes of this subsection, the
5 term "separating employer" shall mean the last employer of the
6 claimant.

7 Section 2. This act shall apply to initial claims filed on
8 or after July 1, 2012.

9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
