## A RESOLUTION

Designating the week beginning May 23, 2011, as "Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is the most common and
devastating form of Muscular Dystrophy that affects about one in
3,600 male infants; and
WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy appears between the ages of two and six years and as early as infancy, affecting approximately 400 to 600 young boys born with this condition each year, each of which being deprived of the opportunity of a full and vibrant life; and

WHEREAS, The Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy gene provides the blueprints for the protein Dystrophin, a protein found in the muscles, which functions in keeping the muscles intact and strong as they contract and relax; and

WHEREAS, The Dystrophin gene is found in every muscle of the body but more prominently seen in the skeletal and cardiac muscles which, respectively, are primarily used for bodily movement and heart functions leading to rapidly worsening muscle weakness and heart conditions; and

WHEREAS, As this disease worsens, the afflicted child experiences chronic fatigue, falling, difficulty with motor skills such as running, jumping and hopping and rapidly worsening weakness, particularly in the legs, pelvis, arms and neck; and

WHEREAS, Between the ages of nine and 13 years, most boys require a motorized wheelchair to get around because they have lost all ability and strength to move and function on their own; and

WHEREAS, Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy is 100\% fatal, with life expectancy in the mid 20's, due to lung or heart complications; and

WHEREAS, No cure has been found for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy; and

WHEREAS, To control symptoms and slow the progression of muscle weakness, the typical drug is corticosteroid, which helps the muscle but has a number of negative side effects on patients; and

WHEREAS, Drug companies will not sponsor corticosteroid for trial; and

WHEREAS, Devices such as leg braces are used to maximize quality of life; and

WHEREAS, "Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Week" provides an opportunity for families and young boys whose lives have been significantly altered to celebrate life and an
opportunity for everyone to honor them as they deal with the daily struggles that are encountered, to honor those health professionals dedicated to helping those who are suffering and to let them all be aware that they are not alone in this challenge; and

WHEREAS, Establishing "Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Week" will also provide the opportunities for families to share in their experience with the public and to raise public awareness that Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy should receive the public and medical attention that is deserved; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the week beginning May 23, 2011, as "Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it further RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage all citizens to increase awareness, education and services for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, which each year affects thousands of young boys and their families.
