A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee AND THE 1 JOINT STATE GOVERNMENT COMMISSION to study the financial and 2 administrative effectiveness of the emergency medical 3 services system. 4 5 WHEREAS, The Emergency Medical Services System Act was enacted as 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 81 (relating to emergency medical 6 7 services system) to replace the former act of July 3, 1985 8 (P.L.164, No.45), known as the Emergency Medical Services Act; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, The enactment of the Emergency Medical Services 11 System Act was the culmination of years of research and 12 preparation to update the emergency medical services delivery 13 system in this Commonwealth; and 14 WHEREAS, The Emergency Medical Services System Act changed 15 the emergency medical services delivery system from a system based on national standards to a system based on curriculum; and 16

1 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth should continually assess and 2 revise the statutes and regulations which govern the functions 3 of emergency medical services agencies and providers and other components of the emergency medical services system; and 4 5 WHEREAS, It is the public policy of the General Assembly to 6 ensure that the emergency medical services system adapts to 7 changing needs of the residents of this Commonwealth and 8 promotes the recruitment and retention of persons willing and 9 qualified to serve as emergency medical services providers in 10 this Commonwealth; and

11 WHEREAS, The General Assembly finds it to be in the public 12 interest to ensure readily available and coordinated emergency 13 medical services of the highest quality to the citizens of this 14 great Commonwealth; and

15 WHEREAS, There have been many changes in technology and 16 organizational administration since the inception of the former 17 Emergency Medical Services Act, such as the advent of the 18 community college system, online computer courses, national 19 associations and local area programs for emergency medical 20 services training; and

21 WHEREAS, Changes in technology, systems management, 22 infrastructure and communications capabilities allow for the 23 Commonwealth to explore more beneficial approaches for the 24 provision of the highest quality system for the delivery of 25 emergency medical services, training and planning, as well as 26 all-hazard emergency preparedness and disaster response training 27 and planning; and

28 WHEREAS, The approximate \$11,800,000 in annual funding for 29 these emergency medical services under the Emergency Medical 30 Services Operating Fund may be more effectively used under a

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1 more streamlined system which uses existing training, planning 2 and infrastructure resources; and

3 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's Regional Counter-Terrorism Task 4 Force infrastructure is a model for the country and may serve as 5 a model for streamlining the current emergency medical services 6 system in this Commonwealth; therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
8 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study the financial
9 and administrative effectiveness of the emergency medical
10 services system, including the responsibility of the Bureau of
11 Emergency Medical Services and the use, role and effectiveness
12 of the 16 regional emergency medical services councils; and be
13 it further

14 RESOLVED, THAT THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES DIRECT THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT A 15 PERFORMANCE REVIEW OF THE FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION OF THE 16 17 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SYSTEM UNDER THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL 18 SERVICES OPERATING FUND. THE PERFORMANCE REVIEW SHALL INCLUDE AN ANALYSIS OF THE BUREAU OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, THE 19 20 PENNSYLVANIA EMERGENCY HEALTH SERVICE COUNCIL AND THE 16 REGIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES COUNCILS; AND BE IT FURTHER 21 22 RESOLVED, That the committee JOINT STATE GOVERNMENT 23 COMMISSION explore enhancing the current system for the delivery 24 of the Commonwealth's emergency medical system through the use 25 of existing government and private sector programs, 26 institutions, facilities and infrastructure resources and 27 nationally recognized associations and organizations to AND THAT 28 THE COMMISSION especially explore the feasibility of using the 29 Commonwealth's many colleges and universities and community 30 colleges, taking into account the availability of online

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1 services and courses and the use of adjunct professors; and be

2 it further

3 RESOLVED, That the committee JOINT STATE GOVERNMENT COMMISSION examine the possibility of streamlining and 4 restructuring the regional emergency medical services system and 5 6 examine the feasibility of matching the regional emergency 7 medical services councils to the current regional counter-8 terrorism zones within this Commonwealth to minimize the duplication of services and overlapping jurisdictions; and be it 9 10 further

11 RESOLVED, That the committee LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE 12 COMMITTEE prepare a comprehensive listing of both the 13 expenditures of the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund 14 and a comprehensive listing of all compensation packages of all 15 employees of the regional emergency medical services councils 16 INCLUDING THE PENNSYLVANIA EMERGENCY HEALTH SERVICES COUNCIL; 17 and be it further

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18 RESOLVED, That the committee make recommendations for a more
19 streamlined delivery model based on the findings of the

20 committee; and be it further

21 RESOLVED, That the committee issue a report of its findings22 and recommendations to the Veterans Affairs and Emergency-
