A RESOLUTION

1 2	Declaring September 2011 as "Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, commonly known as
4	FASD, is the leading known cause of intellectual disabilities
5	and birth defects in the United States; and
6	WHEREAS, One out of every 100 live births in the United
7	States results in a child with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder,
8	commonly known as FASD; and
9	WHEREAS, Six to eight billion dollars is spent each year
10	treating the consequences of FASD; and
11	WHEREAS, FASD includes Fetal Alcohol Syndrome,
12	Alcohol-Related Neuro-Developmental Disorder and Alcohol-Related
13	Birth Defects; and
14	WHEREAS, FASD can result in central nervous system damage,

1 growth deficiency, functional and cognitive impairments,

2 physical defects and mental abnormalities; and

3 WHEREAS, Education can help inform the public about4 prevention and consequences; and

5 WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine has declared that of all 6 the substances of abuse, alcohol produces by far the most 7 serious neurobehavioral effects in the fetus; therefore be it 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 9 month of September 2011 as "Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder 10 Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
