Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in registration of vehicles, further providing for vehicles exempt from registration; in commercial drivers, further providing for definitions; and in inspection of vehicles, further providing for requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles, for operation of vehicle without official certificate of inspection and for width of vehicles. 8 AMENDING TITLE 75 (VEHICLES) OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES, IN SIZE, WEIGHT AND LOAD, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR 10 WIDTH OF VEHICLES. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1.
