## AN ACT

- Designating and adopting the Piper J-3 Cub as the official airplane of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Piper J-3 Cub was built in Lock Haven,
- 4 Pennsylvania, between 1937 and 1947 and played a major role in
- 5 the growth of the small aviation aircraft industry; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Piper J-3 Cub was originally intended for flight
- 7 training but became one of the most popular and best-known light
- 8 aircraft of all time, prompting comparisons to the Ford Model T
- 9 automobile; and
- 10 WHEREAS, During World War II, the Piper J-3 Cub was the
- 11 primary trainer aircraft for the Civilian Pilot Training Program
- 12 and by the war's end, 80% of all United States military pilots
- 13 received their initial flight training in the Piper J-3 Cub; and
- 14 WHEREAS, After World War II, the Piper J-3 cub, built
- 15 exclusively in Lock Haven, found new popularity with private
- 16 pilots.
- 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 hereby enacts as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Official State airplane.
- 2 The Piper J-3 Cub is hereby designated and adopted as the
- 3 official airplane of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 4 Section 2. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect immediately.
