## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for
- form of permanent recordation and for copies of destroyed
- 4 records.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Sections 4323 and 4324 of Title 42 of the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 9 § 4323. Form of [permanent] recordation.
- 10 (a) In general. -- Records may be reproduced in accordance
- 11 with subsection (c).
- 12 (b) Records of permanent value. -- Records which are
- 13 classified as records of permanent value shall, prior to
- 14 destruction or other removal from the office of the person
- 15 having custody thereof, be processed in conformity with general
- 16 rules so that they may be reproduced [by any photostatic,
- 17 photographic, microphotographic, microfilm, video tape, magnetic
- 18 tape, or other mechanical process which produces a clear,
- 19 accurate and permanent copy, microcopy or reproduction of the

- 1 original, in accordance with standards not less than those
- 2 approved for permanent records by the National Bureau of
- 3 Standards.] in accordance with subsection (c).
- 4 (c) Means of reproduction. -- Any photostatic, photographic,
- 5 microphotographic, microfilm, microcard, miniature photographic,
- 6 optical, electronic or other process, analog or digital, which
- 7 <u>accurately reproduces the original and forms secure and</u>
- 8 <u>unalterable copies for recording, storing and reproducing the</u>
- 9 <u>original in accordance with standards, policies and procedures</u>
- 10 for the creation, maintenance, transmission or reproduction of
- 11 <u>images of records approved by the governing authority may be</u>
- 12 <u>utilized for reproducing records as authorized in accordance</u>
- 13 <u>with this subchapter.</u>
- 14 (d) Documents previously recorded, copied or recopied. -- Any
- 15 document within the scope of this section and which previously
- 16 has been recorded, copied or recopied also may be reproduced by
- 17 processes authorized by this section.
- 18 § 4324. Copies of destroyed records.
- 19 [The photostatic, photographic, microphotographic,
- 20 microfilmed or otherwise reproduced] A copy of any record
- 21 destroyed or disposed of as authorized pursuant to this
- 22 subchapter, or a certified copy thereof, <u>if produced in</u>
- 23 accordance with section 4323 (relating to form of recordation)
- 24 shall be admissible in evidence in any matter, and shall have
- 25 the same force and effect as though the original record had been
- 26 produced and proved. It shall be the duty of the person who
- 27 would have had custody of the original record, had it not been
- 28 destroyed pursuant to law, to prepare enlarged, typed or
- 29 photographic copies of such reproduced records whenever their
- 30 production is required.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
