A fire department vehicle, police-2 3 vehicle, sheriff vehicle, ambulance, advanced life support squad vehicle, basic life support squad vehicle, blood delivery-4 vehicle, human organ delivery vehicle, hazardous material 5 response vehicle, armed forces emergency vehicle, one vehicle-6 operated by a coroner or chief county medical examiner and one-7 8 vehicle operated by a chief deputy coroner or deputy chief 9 county medical examiner used for answering emergency calls, a 10 vehicle owned by or leased to a regional emergency medicalservices council that is used as authorized by the Department of-11 Health to respond to an actual or potential disaster, mass-12 13 casualty situation or substantial threat to public health, <u>a-</u> vehicle owned by a county or regional police association that is 14 used for police transport or victim extraction, any vehicle 15 16 operated by a special agent, special agent supervisor, narcotics agent or narcotics agent supervisor while performing official 17 duties as employees of the Office of Attorney General, any-18 19 vehicle owned and operated by the Philadelphia Parking Authorityestablished in accordance with 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 55 (relating to 20 parking authorities) and used in the enforcement of 53 Pa.C.S. 21 Ch. 57 (relating to taxicabs and limousines in first class-22 23 cities), or any other vehicle designated by the State Police-24 under section 6106 (relating to designation of emergency-25 vehicles by Pennsylvania State Police), or a privately owned 26 vehicle used in answering an emergency call when used by any of 27 the following: 28 (1) A police chief and assistant chief. 29 (2) A fire chief, assistant chief and, when a fire-

CHIEF DEPUTY CORONER OR DEPUTY CHIEF COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER 1 2 USED FOR ANSWERING EMERGENCY CALLS, A VEHICLE OWNED BY OR LEASED 3 TO A REGIONAL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES COUNCIL THAT IS USED AS AUTHORIZED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO RESPOND TO AN ACTUAL 4 5 OR POTENTIAL DISASTER, MASS CASUALTY SITUATION OR SUBSTANTIAL THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH, A VEHICLE OWNED BY A COUNTY OR REGIONAL 6 7 POLICE ASSOCIATION AND OPERATED BY A POLICE OFFICER THAT IS USED 8 FOR POLICE TRANSPORT OR VICTIM EXTRACTION, ANY VEHICLE OPERATED 9 BY A SPECIAL AGENT, SPECIAL AGENT SUPERVISOR, NARCOTICS AGENT OR 10 NARCOTICS AGENT SUPERVISOR WHILE PERFORMING OFFICIAL DUTIES AS EMPLOYEES OF THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL, ANY VEHICLE OWNED 11 AND OPERATED BY THE PHILADELPHIA PARKING AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED 12 IN ACCORDANCE WITH 53 PA.C.S. CH. 55 (RELATING TO PARKING 13 14 AUTHORITIES) AND USED IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF 53 PA.C.S. CH. 57 15 (RELATING TO TAXICABS AND LIMOUSINES IN FIRST CLASS CITIES), OR 16 ANY OTHER VEHICLE DESIGNATED BY THE STATE POLICE UNDER SECTION 6106 (RELATING TO DESIGNATION OF EMERGENCY VEHICLES BY 17 18 PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE), OR A PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLE USED IN 19 ANSWERING AN EMERGENCY CALL WHEN USED BY ANY OF THE FOLLOWING: 20 (1) A POLICE CHIEF AND ASSISTANT CHIEF. 21 (2) A FIRE CHIEF, ASSISTANT CHIEF AND, WHEN A FIRE 22 COMPANY HAS THREE OR MORE FIRE VEHICLES, A SECOND OR THIRD 23 ASSISTANT CHIEF. 24 (3) A FIRE POLICE CAPTAIN AND FIRE POLICE LIEUTENANT. 25 (4) AN AMBULANCE CORPS COMMANDER AND ASSISTANT 26 COMMANDER.

27 (5) A RIVER RESCUE COMMANDER AND ASSISTANT COMMANDER.

28 (6) A COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR.

29 (7) A FIRE MARSHAL.

30 (8) A RESCUE SERVICE CHIEF AND ASSISTANT CHIEF.
