- 10 Section 101. Short title. This act shall be known and may
- 11 be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 2012.
- 12 Section 102. Definitions. The following words and phrases

- 10 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive-
- 11 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses-
- 12 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for-
- 13 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012, and for the payment of
- 14 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal-
- 15 year ending June 30, 2012. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 16 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal-
- 17 year.
- 18 Section 106. Block grants. (a) Appropriation. The
- 19 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 20 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
- 21 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 22 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes-
- 23 and under the restrictions for which the funds are provided for
- 24 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012.
- 25 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. The Small
- 26 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small-
- 27 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 28 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 29 low income and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet
- 30 community development needs.

- 1 (c) Community Services Block Grant. The Community Services
- 2 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 3 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on-
- 4 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 5 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In-
