AN ACT

Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, providing for volunteer emergency response personnel. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: 8 § 7309. Volunteer emergency response personnel. 9 (a) Emergency assignments. --(1) Employees who are volunteer health or emergency 10 response personnel are entitled to a leave of absence from 11 12 their respective duties without loss of time or efficiency 13 rating on all days they are engaged in a declared emergency 14 response. 15 (2) Any person whose employment with an employer is interrupted by a period of service as a member of volunteer 16 health or emergency response personnel shall be permitted, 17

1 upon request of that person, to use during such period of

2 service any vacation, annual or similar leave with pay

- accrued by the person before the commencement of such
- 4 <u>service. No employer may require any such person to use</u>
- 5 <u>vacation, annual or similar leave during such period of</u>
- 6 <u>service.</u>

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- (b) Requirements.--
- 8 (1) Employees who are volunteers must be members of a
 9 bona fide health or emergency response organization
- 10 recognized by the Department of Health or the agency.
- 11 (2) The organization or employee must be acting under a
- declared emergency by the Federal, State or local government,
- and all persons must be deemed responding under the
- 14 <u>operational control of the requesting Federal, State or local</u>
- 15 government.
- 16 (3) It shall be the responsibility of the employee to
- supply his employer with a statement from the head of the
- 18 responding organization or government stating that the
- 19 services of the employee are needed. If the employee is
- 20 unable to provide said statement prior to responding to an
- 21 <u>emergency</u>, then the employee shall make a good faith effort
- 22 to inform his employer at the earliest possible time.
- 23 (4) The employer shall have the burden of proving that
- 24 an employee knowingly and willfully failed to provide notice.
- 25 (5) An employee who takes a leave of absence as provided
- for under this section shall be deemed to have notified the
- 27 employer of the employee's intent to return to his employment
- when his services are no longer needed as determined by the
- 29 <u>head of the responding organization or government.</u>
- 30 (6) The leave authorized under this section shall be for

- 1 <u>up to 15 days.</u>
- 2 (c) Discretionary leave. -- Nothing in this section shall be
- 3 construed to prohibit employers from providing paid leave or
- 4 <u>other compensation or continued medical and other benefits to an</u>
- 5 employee requesting a leave of absence under this section or for
- 6 any days in excess of those provided in subsection (b).
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
