AN ACT

Amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), entitled, as 1 reenacted and amended, "An act defining the liability of an 2 employer to pay damages for injuries received by an employe 3 in the course of employment; establishing an elective 4 schedule of compensation; providing procedure for the 5 determination of liability and compensation thereunder; and 6 prescribing penalties," further providing for workers' 7 compensation benefits for certain emergency medical services 8 personnel. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. Section 601(a)(1), (2) and (3) and (c) of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' 13 Compensation Act, reenacted and amended June 21, 1939 (P.L.520, 14 No.281) and amended July 11, 1980 (P.L.577, No.121), are amended 15 16 to read: 17 Section 601. (a) In addition to those persons included 18 within the definition of the word "employe" as defined in 19 section 104, "employe" shall also [include:] MEAN AND COMPENSATION SHALL BE PAID TO: 20

1 (1) members of volunteer fire departments or volunteer fire <--2 companies, including any paid fireman who is a member of a 3 volunteer fire company and performs the services of a volunteer fireman for another department or company during off duty hours, 4 who shall be entitled to receive compensation in case of 5 injuries received while actively engaged as firemen or while 6 7 going to or returning from a fire which the fire company or fire-8 department attended including travel from and the direct returnto a fireman's home, place of business or other place where he-9 10 shall have been when he received the call or alarm or while participating in instruction fire drills in which the fire-11 12 department or fire company shall have participated or while-13 repairing or doing other work about or on the fire apparatus or-14 buildings and grounds of the fire company or fire department 15 upon the authorization of the chief of the fire company or fire-16 department or other person in charge or while answering any-17 emergency calls for any purpose or while riding upon the fire 18 apparatus which is owned or used by the fire company or fire-19 department or while performing any other duties of such fire-20 company or fire department as authorized by the responding 21 municipality or while performing duties imposed by section 15, 22 act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), referred to as the Fire-23 and Panic Act; 24 (2) [all] members of volunteer [ambulance corps of the 25 various municipalities who shall be and are hereby declared tobe employes of such] emergency medical services agencies, as 26 27 provided for under 35 Pa.C.S. § 8103 (relating to definitions),_ who are volunteers, including any paid emergency medical 28 responder who is a member of a volunteer emergency medical_ 29 services agency and performs the services of a volunteer 30

(a) The following shall apply: 18 (1) A municipality or an area of a municipality which 19 receives emergency services pursuant to a contract, standing 20 agreement or arrangement from a volunteer emergency service 21 provider located in a host or responding municipality shall <---22 reimburse the host municipality under the provisions of either 23 clause (2) or (3). 24 (2) Reimbursement under clause (1) shall be for a portion of 25 the cost of the workers' compensation premiums covering the members of the volunteer emergency service provider. The 26 appropriate portion of the cost shall be determined as follows: 27 28 (i) Determine the population ratio of the municipality or 29 the area of the municipality receiving emergency services to the entire population (host <u>or responding</u> municipality and the 30 <---

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1 municipality or the area of the municipality) receiving 2 emergency services from the volunteer emergency service 3 provider. The following shall apply:

8 (B) If the first due area for fire protection services and 9 the first due area for emergency medical services differ within 10 a municipality or an area of a municipality receiving emergency 11 services, then the ratio under subclause (i) shall be calculated 12 using the first due area for fire protection services.

14 <u>responding</u> municipality's entire cost of the workers'
15 compensation premium for covering <u>volunteer</u> members of the
16 volunteer emergency <u>fservice</u> provider. <--</p>

17 (3) The host <u>or responding</u> municipality and the municipality <--18 receiving the emergency services may agree to share the cost on 19 some other basis.

18 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
