The term includes prostitution, participation in the 2 3 production of pornography and performance in strip clubs and sexual activity induced by force, fraud or coercion, either 4 express or implied, regardless of the age of the victim. 5 * * * 6 Section 2. Section 3002 of Title 18 is amended to read: 7 § 3002. Trafficking of persons. 8 9 Offense defined. -- A person commits [an offense] the (a) offense of trafficking in persons if the person knowingly 10 11 traffics or knowingly attempts to traffic another person, 12 knowing that the other person will be subjected to forced labor 13 or services or commercial sex. 14 Grading.--An offense under subsection (a) shall be (b) 15 graded a felony of the second degree unless the other person 16 suffers bodily injury or the other person is an individual under 18 years of age, whether or not the person is aware of the age 17 18 of the other person, in which case it shall be graded as a 19 felony of the first degree. 20 Section 3. 6	"Prostitution." The term shall have the same meaning as
7	provided for in 18 Pa.C.S. § 5902 (relating to prostitution and
8	related offenses).

9 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
