## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing integrated amendments to the Constitution of the
- 2 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for the election of
- the Insurance Commissioner; and further providing for the
- 4 qualifications thereof.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby resolves as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The following integrated amendments to the
- 8 Constitution of Pennsylvania are proposed in accordance with
- 9 Article XI:
- 10 (1) That Article IV be amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 § 4.2. Insurance Commissioner.
- 12 <u>An Insurance Commissioner shall be chosen by the qualified</u>
- 13 electors of the Commonwealth on the day the general election is
- 14 <u>held for the Auditor General and State Treasurer; the Insurance</u>
- 15 Commissioner shall hold office during four years from the third
- 16 Tuesday of January next ensuing his election and shall not be
- 17 eligible to serve continuously for more than two successive
- 18 terms; the Insurance Commissioner shall be the chief officer of
- 19 the Insurance Department and shall exercise such powers and

- 1 perform such duties as may be imposed by law. No elected
- 2 Insurance Commissioner may be employed directly or indirectly by
- 3 <u>an insurance company within four years after serving as</u>
- 4 <u>Insurance Commissioner.</u>
- 5 (2) That section 5 of Article IV be amended to read:
- 6 § 5. Qualifications of Governor, Lieutenant Governor [and],\_
- 7 Attorney General <u>and Insurance Commissioner</u>.
- 8 No person shall be eligible to the office of Governor,
- 9 Lieutenant Governor [or] Lattorney General or Insurance
- 10 <u>Commissioner</u> except a citizen of the United States, who shall
- 11 have attained the age of 30 years, and have been seven years
- 12 next preceding his election an inhabitant of this Commonwealth,
- 13 unless he shall have been absent on the public business of the
- 14 United States or of this Commonwealth. No person shall be
- 15 eligible to the office of Attorney General except a member of
- 16 the bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
- 17 (3) That section 6 of Article IV be amended to read:
- 18 § 6. Disqualification for offices of Governor, Lieutenant
- Governor [and], Attorney General and Insurance
- 20 Commissioner.
- 21 No member of Congress or person holding any office (except of
- 22 attorney-at-law or in the National Guard or in a reserve
- 23 component of the armed forces of the United States) under the
- 24 United States or this Commonwealth shall exercise the office of
- 25 Governor, Lieutenant Governor [or], Attorney General or
- 26 Insurance Commissioner.
- 27 (4) That section 17 of Article IV be amended to read:
- 28 § 17. Contested elections of Governor, Lieutenant Governor
- 29 [and], Attorney General and Insurance Commissioner;
- when succeeded.

- 1 The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall preside upon the
- 2 trial of any contested election of Governor, Lieutenant Governor
- 3 [or], Attorney General or Insurance Commissioner and shall
- 4 decide questions regarding the admissibility of evidence, and
- 5 shall, upon request of the committee, pronounce his opinion upon
- 6 other questions of law involved in the trial. The Governor,
- 7 Lieutenant Governor [and] Lattorney General and Insurance
- 8 Commissioner shall exercise the duties of their respective
- 9 offices until their successors shall be duly qualified.
- 10 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 11 Assembly of these proposed constitutional amendments, the
- 12 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 13 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 14 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 15 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 16 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 17 passage of these proposed constitutional amendments.
- 18 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of these
- 19 proposed constitutional amendments, the Secretary of the
- 20 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 21 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 22 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 23 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 24 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 25 these proposed constitutional amendments. The Secretary of the
- 26 Commonwealth shall submit the proposed constitutional amendments
- 27 under section 1 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth
- 28 as a single ballot question at the first primary, general or
- 29 municipal election which meets the requirements of and is in
- 30 conformance with section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of

- 1 Pennsylvania and which occurs at least three months after the
- 2 proposed constitutional amendments are passed by the General
- 3 Assembly. Upon approval of the amendments by the electors, there
- 4 shall be a vacancy in the office of the Insurance Commissioner
- 5 which shall be filled as provided herein.
