## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for testing for controlled 5 substances for prospective employees. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 9 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 section to read: 12 Section 111.1. Testing for Controlled Substances for Prospective Employes. -- (a) This section shall apply to all 13 14 prospective employes of public and private schools, intermediate 15 units and area vocational-technical schools, including 16 independent contractors and their employes, except those THE FOLLOWING: 17 (1) THOSE employes and independent contractors and their 18 19 employes who have no direct contact with children-; AND <--

- 1 (2) SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS AND BUS DRIVERS WHO ARE SUBJECT TO
- 2 TESTING PURSUANT TO FEDERAL MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY REGULATIONS.
- 3 (b) School administrators of public and private schools,
- 4 <u>intermediate units and area vocational-technical schools shall</u>
- 5 require prospective employes to submit, upon offer of
- 6 employment, a report of drug testing or a statement from a
- 7 <u>testing laboratory relating to the results of the controlled</u>
- 8 <u>substance testing paid for by the applicant. The test and report</u>
- 9 shall be conducted and issued subsequent to the offer of
- 10 employment and prior to the actual hiring date of the applicant.
- 11 School administrators shall maintain a copy of the required
- 12 <u>information and shall require each applicant to produce the</u>
- 13 <u>original document prior to employment. School administrators</u>
- 14 shall require contractors to produce the original document for
- 15 each prospective employe of such contractor prior to employment.
- 16 The provisions of this subsection expire on March 31, 2015.
- 17 (c) Beginning April 1, 2015, school administrators shall
- 18 require the applicant to submit upon offer of employment a copy
- 19 of the controlled substances testing report in a manner
- 20 prescribed by the Department of Education. A controlled
- 21 substances testing report submitted by the applicant must be
- 22 paid for by the applicant and be the result of a controlled
- 23 <u>substances test conducted after the date of the offer of</u>
- 24 employment. When the applicant provides a copy of the controlled
- 25 substances testing report, it shall be dated after offer of
- 26 employment has been made. School administrators shall maintain a
- 27 copy of the required information and shall require each
- 28 applicant to produce a controlled substances testing report that
- 29 shall be dated after the offer of employment has been made. The
- 30 original controlled substances testing report shall be returned

- 1 to the applicant.
- 2 (d) The State Board of Education shall, in the manner
- 3 provided by law, promulgate the regulations necessary to carry <--

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- 4 out this section. The regulations shall provide for the
- 5 information obtained pursuant to the drug testing mandated by
- 6 <u>this act.</u> PROVIDING FOR:
- 7 (1) THE INFORMATION REQUIRED TO BE OBTAINED PURSUANT TO
- 8 A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE TEST MANDATED BY THIS SECTION;
- 9 (2) THE PRIVACY OF THE INFORMATION RELATED TO CONTROLLED
- 10 SUBSTANCE TESTING MANDATED BY THIS SECTION;
- 11 (3) THE RETESTING OF PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYES WHOSE INITIAL
- 12 TEST RESULTED IN A FALSE POSITIVE AND CAN PROVIDE AN
- 13 ALTERNATIVE MEDICAL EXPLANATION VERIFIED BY A LICENSED
- 14 PHYSICIAN;
- 15 (4) THE CERTIFICATION OF TESTING LABORATORIES; AND
- 16 <u>(5) ANY OTHER PROVISION NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS</u>
- 17 SECTION.
- 18 (e) No person subject to this act shall be employed in a
- 19 public or private school, intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 20 technical school where the controlled substances testing report
- 21 indicates the applicant has used a controlled substance without
- 22 a prescription from a physician.
- 23 (f) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 24 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 25 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 26 "Controlled substances." Drugs, substances or immediate
- 27 precursors included in Schedules I through V of section 4 of the
- 28 act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled
- 29 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act."
- 30 "School administrator." An administrator of a public school,

- 1 private school, intermediate unit or area vocational-technical
- 2 school.
- 3 "TESTING LABORATORY." A LABORATORY THAT IS CERTIFIED BY THE <--
- 4 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES OR UNDER REGULATIONS
- 5 PROMULGATED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION THAT IS CAPABLE OF
- 6 PERFORMING CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES TESTING.
- 7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
