## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," further providing for
- 4 prohibited use of public assistance funds.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 484 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
- 8 No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, added December 17,
- 9 2009 (P.L.598, No.54), is amended to read:
- 10 Section 484. Prohibited Use of Public Assistance Funds. -- (a)
- 11 It shall be unlawful for any individual to purchase tobacco,
- 12 tobacco paraphernalia, liquor or alcohol with [a gift
- 13 certificate or a gift card which is in the form of] an
- 14 electronic benefits transfer card issued to convey public
- 15 assistance benefits administered by the [Department of Public

- 1 Welfare] <u>department</u> or a debit card issued to convey support
- 2 payment moneys. The department shall take appropriate measures
- 3 to prevent the use of public assistance funds for the purposes
- 4 proscribed in this section.
- 5 (b) Assistance granted under this article shall not be
- 6 withdrawn or used through a point of sale at any entity licensed
- 7 by the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
