AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for expungement.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Section 9122(b) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by
- 7 adding a subsection to read:
- 8 § 9122. Expungement.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (b) Generally. -- Criminal history record information may be
- 11 expunged [when] if any of the following apply:
- 12 (1) An individual who is the subject of the information
- 13 reaches 70 years of age and has been free of arrest or
- 14 prosecution for ten years following final release from
- 15 confinement or supervision.
- 16 (2) An individual who is the subject of the information
- 17 has been dead for three years.

Т	(3) (1) All Individual who is the subject of the
2	information petitions the court for the expungement of a
3	summary offense and has been free of arrest or
4	prosecution for five years following the conviction for
5	that offense.
6	(ii) Expungement under this paragraph shall only be
7	permitted for a conviction of a summary offense.
8	(4) An individual who is the subject of the information
9	petitions the court for the expungement of an offense and has
10	been free of arrest or prosecution for seven years following
11	the completion of the sentence for that offense. A person is
12	prohibited from having his record expunged under this
13	paragraph if the person has been convicted of any of the
