Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in school finances, further providing for distress in school districts of the first class. 5 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 696 of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by 10 11 adding a subsection to read: 12 Section 696. Distress in School Districts of the First Class.--* * * 13 (n.3) (1) At the first primary, special or general election 14 15 that occurs at least ninety (90) days after the effective date 16 of this subsection, a binding referendum question shall be 17 presented to the electors of the school district of the first 18 class, which referendum shall ask, as a single ballot question, whether the School Reform Commission shall be dissolved and the 19

members of the board of school directors for the school district

- 1 <u>shall be elected</u>, on a nonpartisan basis, by the qualified
- 2 electors.
- 3 (2) If a majority of the qualified electors votes in favor
- 4 of the dissolution of the School Reform Commission and the
- 5 public election of members of the board of school directors,
- 6 then the dissolution shall be effective at least one hundred
- 7 eighty (180) days prior to the end of the current school year
- 8 and shall be effective at the end of that school year.
- 9 (3) The election of members of the board of school directors
- 10 shall occur as soon as practicable in order for the elected
- 11 members to take office prior to the commencement of the
- 12 following school year.

- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
