AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 fiscal year July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act Enforcement Fund and the Energy Conservation and Assistance 17 18 Fund, to the Executive Department; to provide appropriations 19 from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the 20 Judicial Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2013, to June 21 30, 2014; to provide appropriations from the Motor License 22 Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014, for 23 the proper operation of several departments of the 24 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 25 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 26 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 27 the Commonwealth and for the payment of bills remaining 28 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013; 29 30 and to provide for the additional appropriation of Federal 31 and State funds from the General Fund for the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 32 2012, to June 30, 2013, and for the payment of bills incurred 33 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending 34

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- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 PART I
- 11 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 12 Section 101. Short title.
- 13 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 14 Appropriation Act of 2013.
- 15 Section 102. Definitions.

- 5 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 6 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 7 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 8 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 9 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 10 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 11 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 12 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 13 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of

- 26 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.
- 27 The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth
- 28 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 29 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to
- 30 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive

- 1 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses
- 2 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for
- 3 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and for the payment of
- 4 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal
- 5 year ending June 30, 2013. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 6 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal
- 7 year.
- 8 Section 106. Block grants.
- 9 (a) Appropriation. -- The following sums set forth in this
- 10 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 11 specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the
- 12 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
- 13 of the Commonwealth for the purposes and under the restrictions
- 14 for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning
- 15 July 1, 2013.
- 16 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. -- The Small
- 17 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 18 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 19 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 20 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
- 21 community development needs.
- 22 (c) Community Services Block Grant. -- The Community Services
- 23 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 24 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 25 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 26 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 27 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 28 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 29 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 30 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

- 1 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 2 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 3 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 4 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 5 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
- 6 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
- 7 violence services.
- 8 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. -- The
- 9 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 10 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 11 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
- 12 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 13 special health care needs and in providing health services for
- 14 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
- 15 care.
