1 2 3	Designating the section of Pennsylvania Route 232 in Bryn Athyn, Montgomery County, as the SPC Tristan C. Smith Memorial Highway.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. SPC Tristan C. Smith Highway.
7	(a) FindingsThe General Assembly finds and declares as
8	follows:
9	(1) SPC Tristan C. Smith graduated from high school in
10	2002, studied at Bryn Athyn College for two years and joined
11	the United States Army in July 2004.
12	(2) SPC Tristan C. Smith died in Taji, Iraq, on August
13	27, 2006, when an improvised explosive device detonated near
14	his M2A3 Bradley Vehicle during a combat operation.
15	(3) SPC Tristan C. Smith was survived by his parents,

Grant and Kimberly Smith, and his siblings, Alizah, Jennica
 and Jaron.

3 (b) Designation.--The section of Pennsylvania Route 232 in
4 Bryn Athyn, Montgomery County is hereby designated as the SPC
5 Tristan C. Smith Memorial Highway.

6 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and 7 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to 8 traffic in both directions on the highway.

9 Section 2. Effective date.

10 This act shall take effect immediately.
