AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for course scheduling for
- 3 military students.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 17 <u>§ 9701. Scope.</u>

- 1 This chapter relates to a course scheduling preference for
- 2 military students who are enrolled in public institutions of
- 3 higher education to obtain a bachelor's or an associate's
- 4 <u>degree</u>.
- 5 § 9702. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 9 <u>"Active duty military service member." An individual who is</u>
- 10 an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States
- 11 or the National Guard or any other reserve component of the
- 12 armed forces of the United States.
- 13 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 14 Commonwealth.
- 15 "Distance education." A traditional or nontraditional path
- 16 <u>in which a student is enrolled in an approved online education</u>
- 17 program at a public institution of higher education.
- 18 "Nontraditional student." Any undergraduate student over 21
- 19 years of age who has a family and work responsibilities or other
- 20 life circumstances that may interfere with successful completion
- 21 of educational objectives.
- 22 "Public institution of higher education." A community
- 23 college, State-related institution or a member institution of
- 24 the State System of Higher Education.
- 25 "Military student." An individual who meets all of the
- 26 following:
- 27 <u>(1) Is an active duty military service member or a</u>
- veteran.
- 29 (2) Has been admitted to a public institution of higher
- 30 education.

- 1 (3) Resides in this Commonwealth while enrolled in the
- 2 public institution of higher education.
- 3 <u>(4) Is in his or her final year at the public</u>
- 4 <u>institution of higher education and is working toward a</u>
- 5 <u>bachelor's or an associate's degree.</u>
- 6 "Traditional student." A financially dependent student
- 7 <u>matriculating from high school to college who pursues college</u>
- 8 <u>studies on a continuous full-time basis and completes a</u>
- 9 <u>bachelor's degree program in four or five years.</u>
- 10 "Veteran." An individual who meets all of the following:
- 11 (1) Has served in the armed forces of the United States
- or the National Guard or any other reserve component.
- 13 (2) Was discharged or released from such service under
- 14 <u>any conditions other than dishonorable.</u>
- 15 § 9703. Priority scheduling for military students.
- 16 (a) General rule. -- Within 90 days of the effective date of
- 17 this section, a public institution of higher education shall
- 18 provide a scheduling preference to military students to obtain a
- 19 bachelor's or associate's degree over a traditional,
- 20 nontraditional or part-time student taking classes on-campus or
- 21 through distance education.
- 22 (b) Exception.--If a professor offers to open enrollment in
- 23 a class to add a military student, a public institution of
- 24 higher education does not need to offer priority scheduling to
- 25 the military student.
- 26 (c) Existing policies. -- If on the effective date of this
- 27 <u>section a public institution of higher education has established</u>
- 28 and implemented a policy relating to preference in course
- 29 scheduling that includes military students and the policy
- 30 complies with this chapter, the public institution of higher

- 1 education shall not be required to establish and implement a new
- 2 policy under the provisions of this chapter.
- 3 § 9704. Duties of department and public institutions of higher
- 4 <u>education</u>.
- 5 <u>(a) Duties of department.--The department shall have the</u>
- 6 following duties:
- 7 (1) Promulgate regulations to administer this chapter.
- 8 (2) Create a one-page form for public institutions of
- 9 <u>higher education to access and input information required by</u>
- 10 the department through the department's Internet website.
- 11 (3) Share reporting information with the department's
- 12 Office of Postsecondary and Higher Education, Division of
- 13 <u>Veterans and Military Education.</u>
- 14 (4) Share reporting information with the Veterans
- Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate,
- the Education Committee of the Senate, the Veterans Affairs
- 17 and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the House of
- 18 Representatives and the Education Committee of the House of
- 19 Representatives.
- 20 (b) Duties of public institutions of higher
- 21 education. -- Public institutions of higher education shall have
- 22 the following duties:
- 23 (1) Provide the department with information relating to
- 24 an existing priority scheduling policy or a new priority
- 25 scheduling policy.
- 26 (2) Provide the department with information relating to
- 27 <u>the number of military students taking senior-level courses</u>
- to obtain bachelor's or associate's degrees.
- 29 (3) Provide the department with information relating to
- the number of traditional, nontraditional or distance

- 1 education students affected by priority scheduling under this
- 2 <u>chapter.</u>
- 3 <u>§ 9705</u>. Expiration.
- 4 This chapter shall expire December 31, 2018.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
