1 2 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), entitled "An act establishing a fixed minimum wage and overtime rates for employes, with certain exceptions; providing for minimum rates for learners and apprentices; creating a Minimum Wage Advisory Board and defining its powers and duties; conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Labor and Industry; imposing duties on employers; and providing penalties," further providing for minimum wages.

10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Section 4(a) of the act of January 17, 1968
12	(P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968, amended
13	July 5, 2012 (P.L.987, No.109), is amended to read:
14	Section 4. Minimum WagesExcept as may otherwise be
15	provided under this act:
16	(a) Every employer shall pay to each of his or her employes
17	wages for all hours worked at a rate of not less than:
18	(1) Two dollars sixty-five cents (\$2.65) an hour upon the
19	effective date of this amendment.
20	(2) Two dollars ninety cents (\$2.90) an hour during the year

1 beginning January 1, 1979. Three dollars ten cents (\$3.10) an hour during the year 2 (3) 3 beginning January 1, 1980. Three dollars thirty-five cents (\$3.35) an hour after 4 (4) December 31, 1980. 5 Three dollars seventy cents (\$3.70) an hour beginning 6 (5) 7 February 1, 1989. 8 (6) Five dollars fifteen cents (\$5.15) an hour beginning September 1, 1997. 9 10 (7) Six dollars twenty-five cents (\$6.25) an hour beginning 11 January 1, 2007. 12 (8) Seven dollars fifteen cents (\$7.15) an hour beginning 13 July 1, 2007. 14 (9) Nine dollars (\$9) an hour beginning sixty days after the 15 effective date of this paragraph. 16 (10) Ten dollars ten cents (\$10.10) an hour beginning four hundred twenty-five days after the effective date of this 17 18 <u>paragraph.</u> 19 (11) Beginning January 1, 2017, and each succeeding January 1 thereafter, the minimum wage shall be increased by an annual 20 21 cost-of-living adjustment calculated by applying the percentage 22 change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-23 U) for the Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware and Maryland area, 24 for the most recent twelve-month period for which figures have been officially reported by the United States Department of 25 26 Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics sixty days prior to the date the adjustment is due to take effect, to the then current_ 27 minimum wage amount and rounded to the nearest multiple of five 28 29 cents (5¢). The percentage increase and the minimum wage amounts shall be determined by the secretary as herein prescribed and 30
