## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for exemptions and special
- provisions relating to taxation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 8 (1) That section 2(c) of Article VIII be amended to read:
- 9 § 2 Exemptions and special provisions:
- 10 \* \* \*
- 11 (c) [Citizens and residents of this Commonwealth, who served
- 12 in any war or armed conflict in which the United States was
- 13 engaged and were honorably discharged or released under
- 14 honorable circumstances from active service, shall be exempt
- 15 from the payment of all real property taxes upon the residence
- 16 occupied by the said citizens and residents of this Commonwealth
- 17 imposed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or any of its

- 1 political subdivisions if, as a result of military service, they
- 2 are blind, paraplegic or double or quadruple amputees or have a
- 3 service-connected disability declared by the United States
- 4 Veterans Administration or its successor to be a total or 100%
- 5 permanent disability, and if the State Veterans' Commission
- 6 determines that such persons are in need of the tax exemptions
- 7 granted herein. This exemption shall be extended to the
- 8 unmarried surviving spouse upon the death of an eligible veteran
- 9 provided that the State Veterans' Commission determines that
- 10 such person is in need of the exemption.] Citizens and residents
- 11 of this Commonwealth who served in the United States Armed
- 12 Forces, including a reserve component or National Guard, and
- 13 <u>were discharged or released from service under conditions other</u>
- 14 than dishonorable and possess a Federal DD-214 or equivalent
- 15 <u>documentation shall be exempt from the payment of all real</u>
- 16 property taxes of more than 1% of the total assessed value of
- 17 the residence occupied by the said citizens and residents of
- 18 this Commonwealth imposed by the Commonwealth or any of its
- 19 political subdivisions, if they are single or widowed, 65 years
- 20 of age or older, have no immediate family members older than 21
- 21 years of age who reside at the residence and do not have an
- 22 income of more than \$40,000 per year.
- 23 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 24 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
- 25 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 26 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 27 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 28 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 29 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 30 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.

- 1 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this
- 2 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the
- 3 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 4 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 5 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 6 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 7 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 8 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the
- 9 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment
- 10 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 11 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 12 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 13 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 14 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is
- 15 passed by the General Assembly.
