## AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in ownership of property, legal title and equitable estate, further providing for right to dispose of a decedent's remains.

7	Section 1. Section 305(d)(2) of Title 20 of the Pennsylvania
8	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
9	§ 305. Right to dispose of a decedent's remains.

11	(d) ProcedureWhere a petition alleging enduring
12	estrangement, incompetence, contrary intent or waiver and
13	agreement is made within 48 hours of the death or discovery of
14	the body of the decedent, whichever is later, a court may order
15	that no final disposition of the decedent's remains take place
16	until a final determination is made on the petition. Notice to
17	each person with equal or higher precedence than the petitioner
18	to the right to dispose of the decedent's remains and to his

1 attorney if known and to the funeral home or other institution 2 where the body is being held must be provided concurrently with 3 the filing of the petition. A suitable bond may be required by 4 the court.

6 If two [or more] persons with equal standing as next (2) 7 of kin disagree on disposition of the decedent's remains, the 8 authority to dispose shall be determined by the court, with 9 preference given to the person who had the closest relationship with the deceased. If more than two persons with 10 equal standing as next of kin disagree on disposition of the 11 decedent's remains, the authority to dispose shall be 12 determined by the majority. WHERE TWO OR MORE PERSONS WITH 13 <---14 EQUAL STANDING CANNOT REACH A MAJORITY DECISION, THE COURT 15 SHALL MAKE A FINAL DETERMINATION ON DISPOSITION OF THE DECEDENT'S REMAINS. 16 \* \* \* 17 18 Section 2.
